



## A NEW HOME BUILD!

We are so excited to announce that we will soon be starting a new home build. Flanksey is a young man that lives with his grandfather. For several years now he has been in our school sponsorship program. He and his grandfather often receive food assistance as well. He and his grandfather often struggle. Our hearts are full of joy that soon that will have a new home! One Heart 2 Homes is sponsoring this home build.

A new house means that their belongings will no longer get wet, that before school a student can get a good night of rest, during times of security problems or for general safety-the door will lock, and as the body of Christ we have relieved a burden from a brother in Christ.

A new home brings hope for a better tomorrow. It employs people in the community. We purchase materials and supplies locally, investing into the economy. We enter into life on life relationships and give glory to God for those relationships.



It was in late 2015 that Sonja was blessed with a One Heart 2 Homes home build. Supply and Multiply was on location several days of this home build and over time we got to know her and her neighbors.

One of her neighbors was a precious girl named Lovelina. She had various medical concerns and God spoke clearly that we should see how we could assist the family, but we did not know how.

In 2016 the Lord sent someone on a mission team that fell in love with her and she became a monthly sponsor of Supply and Multiply so that we could meet many of her needs on a regularly month basis.

Since that time she has received a pediatric wheelchair, medical care to include several hospitalizations, physical therapy, and food subsidies.

We have shown Christ's compassion and love to her!

Recently when Supply and Multiply hosted Night to Shine sponsored by the Tim Tebow Foundation, she was one of our honored guest! Home builds are about safe, secure, and stable housing, but they are about so much more! They allow us to truly enter into the community, earn trust, and be used of the Holy Spirit however He choses!

## CURRENT NEEDS AND PRAYERS

- ◆ Continued prayers for stability in Haiti. Specifically for roads to be open so that people can attend church, students attend school, supplies can be delivered, and people can travel to receive medical care.
- ◆ Continued prayers for the health and comfort of the Matthew 25 House residents.
- ◆ Continued prayers for the ongoing financial needs of the ministry. In January, in addition to regular expenses, we had three elderly in the hospital and two funerals.
- ◆ To meet the needs of therapy for a young boy that attends our Director Gary's church. He had surgery in Port au Prince, but has not been able to have therapy. He is not walking. The therapist that evaluated him said that he feels that the surgery corrected his problems and now needs therapy. He can receive it at his house and will travel cost for the therapist to come to him, the cost is \$40 weekly. He will need an estimated 24 weeks of care. The estimated cost of his therapy is \$960.
- ◆ An older gentleman was working at the rock quarry and a boulder fell on him. He is unable to work. We need \$200 to rent him a home, \$100 to get him a bed that will be more comfortable for his long term disabilities, and a monthly sponsor of \$35 so that he can be in our Galatians 6:2 program and receive food subsidies.
- ◆ One of our students is completing their University program and their graduation cost is \$600.00. She has worked very hard and this will be her final year. The cost of graduation is above and beyond the cost of tuition.
- ◆ There is a school in Do Finny that is part of the church. They are financially in need of assistance. Many of their students do not pay tuition and are still allowed to attend school. We would like to bless the unpaid teachers with a one time gift.
