These limes are used by the ministry. Some are used to create employment. A farmer picks them, giving the ministry the first harvest. Then he sells others at market. In between harvest he cares for the garden.

Many of you ask...What are your current ministry needs? The short answer is that we need your faithful support of prayer and finances to the ongoing daily operations of the ministry.

The Matthew 25 House, with its residents and staff, has many expenses that go beyond food. We have routine medical bills and medicine, therapy, and building maintenance and upkeep. Recently, the ministry incurred an unexpected well repair. A new breaker and pump motor was needed. Many of our Galatians 6:2 families are sponsored, but not all of them. Additionally, during the last few years of extreme difficulty in Haiti, the request for charity is great. We recently had a funeral expenses for one of our elderly. We have been hit with several storms lately that have brought damage to homes. We have been able to meet those needs in faith. We routinely help cover seizure, blood pressure, diabetes, antibiotics, and other medicines for those in the community. As students return to school we attempt to meet the needs of as many as we can in the community. We routinely respond to needs in the community even for people outside of our program. We help with partial fees, exams, books, and other items to keep them in school. The needs in Haiti are great and ongoing. Prayerful consider partnering with us for the ongoing daily ministry!

When a student tuition cost less than the sponsored amount, that money is passed on to unsponsored students or to cover the cost of the students where tuition is higher. Sometimes we are able to meet the needs of school request for desk, books, and repairs. Some days, this feels like a heavy burden! Then we fall on our knees and turn our eyes to Christ and we watch how he provides the strength and resources to bear one another's burdens.

Pictured to the left is an elderly gentleman that we provide medical care and supplemental food monthly. He always wants prayers and wants you to know that he is praying for you as well! He is often time found on a pile of rocks breaking them to sell. When you encourage him to slow down, he responds "when I slow down, I will stop!"

Pictured to the right is Christina, Tamme, and Kate. They are holding a precious eight week old little boy. He is a victim of Voodoo practitioners. As classically defined, Haiti is not an unreached people group. They have Bibles in their language. There are many Christian churches and pastors, but there are many cultural and pagan impediments to the propagation of the pure Gospel. In many communities, Voodoo is syncretized with Christianity. This is very common all over Haiti. After consulting with our medical ministry partner in the states, Mary, Christina and Tamme along with Wendy and Gary took the baby to the medical clinic to see Dr. Lincoln. His care and prompt attention, with God's grace, turned the course of this child's life.

We praise God that we have a trust within our community where we able to assist in getting medical care and we pray for this child and for the Nation of Haiti to come into a relationship with the one true Savior, Jesus Christ.



Please continue to pray for the stability of Haiti. There has been an increase in theft while people are leaving the Dominican Boarder with goods to sell in Haiti. One family that owns a depot (store) in Montrouis that we often purchase cleaning supplies from was robbed. They sell their products for very little profit and save the profit so that they can purchase more items. They had a thriving business. A set back like this, will cause a business to collapse -putting a family out of work and without finances to provide for their family. The Holy Spirit made it clear that we should meet this need, so we did. Supply and Multiply was able to meet this crisis need and provided them with \$500 to purchase new items for their depot.
