They want the kidnappings to stop, they want their kids to go to school, they want fuel to be able to freely leave the ports and be delivered, they want a police force, they want hospitals and doctors to treat the sick, and they want a functioning government. These desires are basic to any nation. These are not selfish desires.

Let us have compassion on those that are causing the uprising because it is rooted in their desire to have a better tomorrow-though their means of doing so is terrible.

We have no additional information; besides what you can read in the main stream media. We have no idea when things will get stable.



We will give an update on Supply and Multiply but please know that for security reasons it will be vague. The ministry family is safe! They have provisions and are creative to obtain more staple items.

In the weeks leading up to this moment, our director has been wise with preparation and rationing. He is reporting that the residents that we are entrusted to care for are insulated inside their walls and happy. He is trusting that God knows all the details and he is seeking Him for guidance with the use of resources and time out of his home. His family is safe and cared for and the children have been attending school. When it is necessary all the students will stay home. We have been able to be in communication and if we lose communication he clearly understands the plan for the weeks ahead.

We lean on you during this season for prayer. We lean on you during this season for encouragement. We lean on you during this season to not have fatigue with Haiti and her blemishes, but instead let's come together as the Supply and Multiply family and fix our eyes on Christ and pray for God's grace and mercy in the days ahead.
