The current conflict in Ukraine began on 24 February 2022 when Russian military forces entered the country from Belarus, Russia and Crimea. Prior to the invasion, there had already been eight years of conflict in eastern Ukraine between Ukrainian Government forces and Russia backed separatists. An estimated one million Ukrainian refugees seeking safety in Poland with about 400,000 being in Warsaw.

Responding to the Call

A team is heading to Poland in January and we will be participating in the ongoing work with the Ukrainian refugees. We will be directly serving the vulnerable people affected by the war in Ukraine who are seeking safety in Poland.



The ministry we partner with in Poland provides psychosocial support and psychological first aid in response to refugee trauma experiences. Supporting mothers and children fleeing the war in Ukraine, seeking safety in Poland. The activities are focused on the Warsaw area.

There is great need for the arrival of the approved United Nations stabilizing force. We have no timeline for their arrival and the conditions in Haiti remain very volatile. Though we are able to purchase fuel and food currently, the cost is very high and the demand is still greater than the supply.





We are looking forward to the upcoming Christmas season and would like to bless our staff and families in the community with food assistance. We can do this with your support! For \$50 we can provide a family with beans, rice, and oil. This cost is higher than in the past because just like in America, everything cost more. We have 20 families identified to assist. The goal amount for food blessing is \$1000.

In addition, we would like to bless the staff with a Christmas bonus for all of their hard work and dedication. This goal amount of blessing is \$1500.

It is a blessing for the ministry of Supply and Multiply to be moving in increasing directions! We continue to serve our brothers and sisters in Haiti, our Haitian refugees here in America, Ebenezer school in Honduras, in prayers for our friends at Ina Brown Early Childhood Development Center in Jamaica, and now heading to serve on the ground in Poland.
