The answers to questions are not always easy...but we will answer them.

What are the current conditions in Haiti?

“Since 12 September 2022, Haiti has been rocked by at times violent protests that have paralyzed the country, including the activities of humanitarian partners.”

However, if you have been following Supply and Multiply for any period of time, you know that even though this is the worst it has been in modern history, this is not new.

“Roadblocks have sprung up across the streets of major cities, affecting mobility and limiting access to food and water. The fuel supply crisis has worsened and is severely disrupting electricity and telecommunications.”

Business, Government Buildings, and Humanitarian partners have reported looting of storage warehouses and attempted break-ins at their facilities.

What are the current conditions for Supply and Multiply?

The answer changes day by day. There has been roadblocks, looting, and general chaos in our ministry area for sporadic periods of time, but we praise God that it is not on going, though unpredictable.

Food, water, and fuel is very difficult to obtain and is very expensive. Just the other day reports for a 45 pound bag of rice cost \$70. Today at Walmart in America you can buy 50 pounds of rice for \$29.35. The average salary in Haiti is less than \$730 a year and currently many have no work to even earn the bare minimum. A bell pepper was \$1 and gas is very expensive. Please keep in mind that even if you have money, you still may not be able to find the items you need.

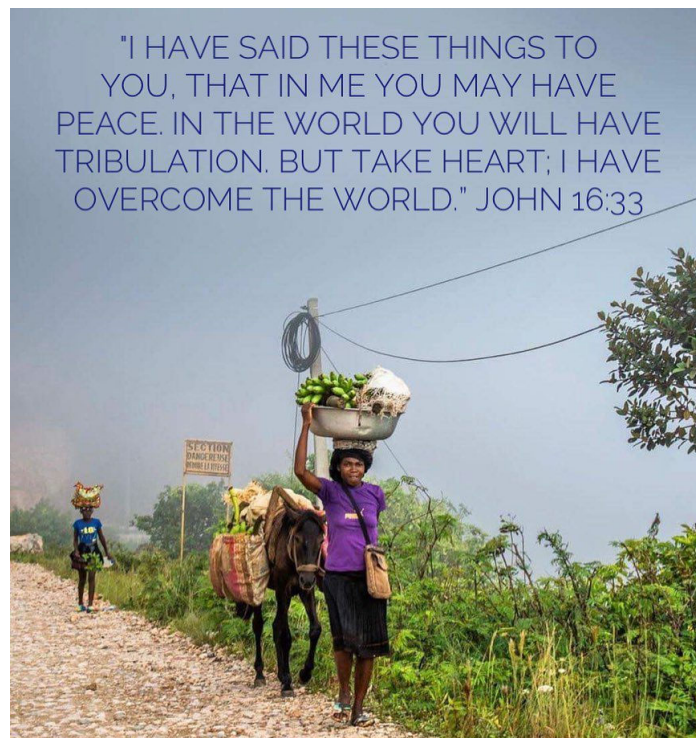
We are entering into a few crisis situations in the near future.

- We provide the generator and fuel that pump water from the river to our village. That water allows for substance farming and is very important to our community. The price of fuel and the difficulty to obtain the fuel is a challenge.
- We have about twenty mouths to feed daily between our Director and his family and those that we are committed to care for that reside with us. The current situation is that water and food are hard to find, very expensive, dangerous to get, and money is low.
- Safety is a concern. There is no person or location off limits to the forces of evil that plague Haiti today.

School has been delayed for the students. This effects so many areas. Many children eat at school one meal a day and depend on that meal. We have paid the tuition for our students and are prayerful for a start date soon.

How can you help?

Currently, we cannot go to Haiti nor send supplies. The custom yards and ports are often under attack, so we do not want to lose items. We need your prayers and ongoing financial support.
