Update on the Conditions in Haiti

Haiti continues to face severe and compounding challenges. Political instability, widespread violence, and economic collapse have disrupted daily life across much of the country. Many families struggle to meet basic needs, and access to education, medical care, and consistent food supply remains fragile. In many regions, normal rhythms of life have been replaced by uncertainty and fear.

Despite these conditions, Supply & Multiply remains present and committed.

Our residential care facility continues to operate, providing safety, stability, and daily care for those entrusted to us. In a nation where displacement and insecurity are common, the simple consistency of shelter, routine, and loving oversight has become a profound gift.

Education remains one of the most powerful long-term investments we can make in Haiti's future.

We continue to provide housing assistance and food support as resources allow. While needs far exceed what any single organization can meet, we do the best we can, responding faithfully, carefully stewarding resources, and ensuring help reaches those most vulnerable.

The work in Haiti today is not about expansion or visibility. It is about faithful presence. It is about staying, serving, and loving quietly in difficult conditions. We remain deeply grateful for the partners and supporters who make this ongoing ministry possible. What continues in Haiti does so because of shared commitment, prayer, and generosity.

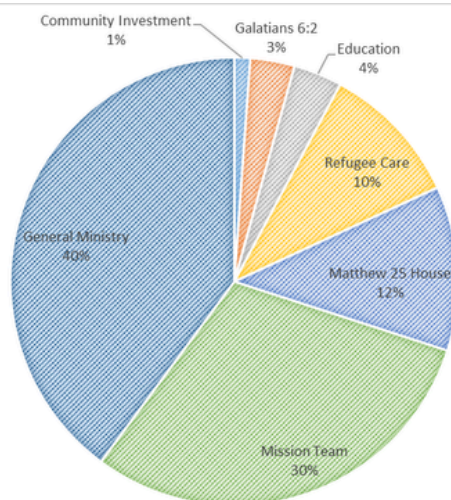
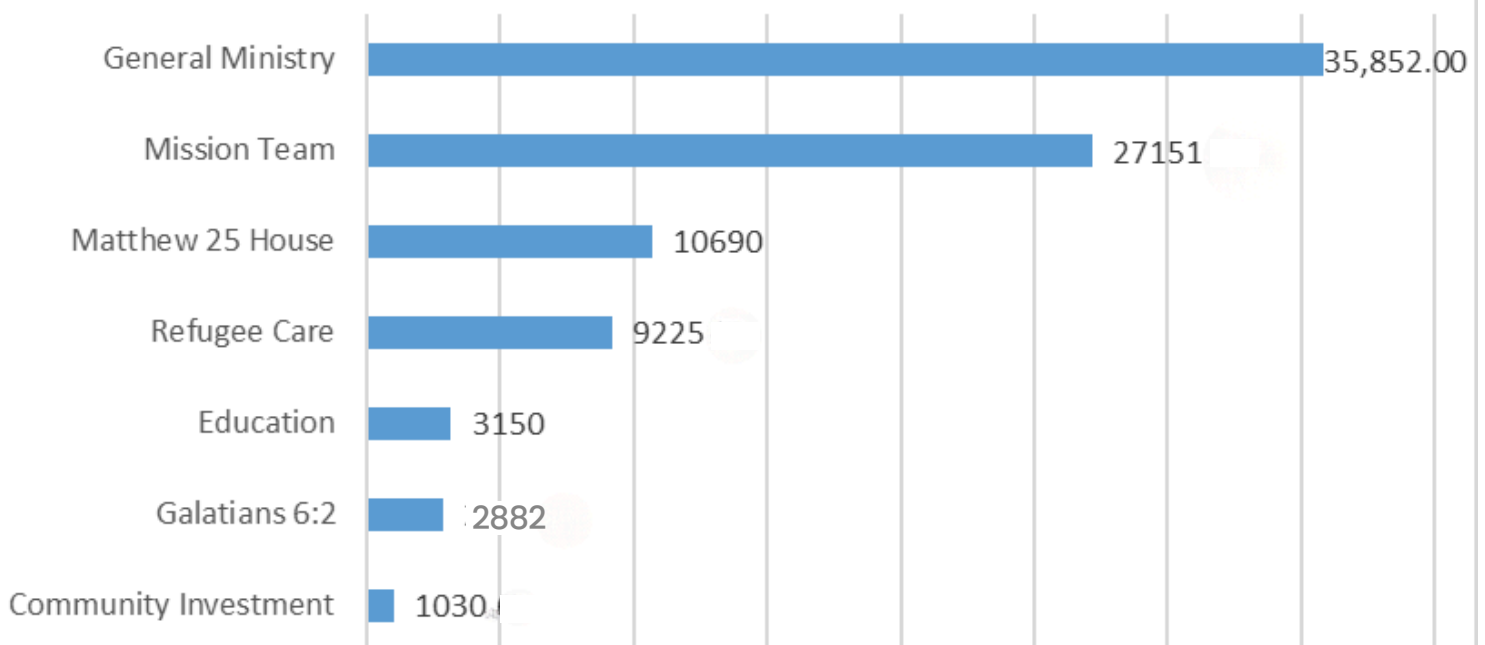


Financial Overview

- Walking forward with humility, hope, and trust in God's provision

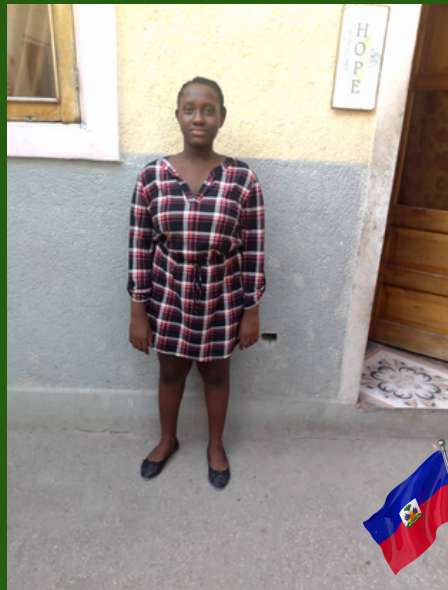

Matthew 25 House

The Matthew 25 House located in Montrouis Haiti is focused on serving the vulnerable and sharing the love of Christ. Inspired by the words of Jesus in Matthew 25:31-46, the Matthew 25 House provides care for the elderly and most vulnerable in the community of Montrouis, Haiti.

Mission and Purpose

The Matthew 25 House embodies Christ's call to care for "the least of these," focusing on providing:

*Dignity and Care: Offering shelter, meals, and medical attention to elderly individuals who often have no other means of support.

*Spiritual Encouragement: Sharing the hope of the Gospel through prayer, Bible studies, and compassionate care, reminding residents that they are loved and valued by God.

*Community Impact: Serving as a beacon of hope and an example of Christian love in action, fostering a spirit of generosity and service within the broader community.

Why It Matters

In Haiti, where poverty and lack of resources often leave the elderly vulnerable and overlooked, the Matthew 25 House steps in to provide critical care. The ministry addresses not only physical needs but also emotional and spiritual ones, ensuring residents feel seen, loved, and supported in their later years.
