Valeria Privett: Yes, I have a seed feeders & fruit feeders and 2 hummingbird feeders. The hummers are my favorites

Rebecca and Robert Holton: We have 4 feeders for hummers and 1 for Niger seed. Hooded Orioles are our favorites.

Mary Ann Rodarte: We have 6 feeders: Thistle, Sunflower & regular bird seed and 3 hummingbird feeders. I quit feeding hummers in June so they go

to my flowers. My favorites are the Scrub Jays and they like the peanuts.

Carl Hurst: I have one hummingbird feeder and plan on getting a seed feeder.

Pene Manale: I have 3 hummingbird feeders and 1 seed feeder. My favorite is the hummers.

Bonnie Crawford: I have 3 hummingbird feeders and 5 seed feeders. Mourning doves are my favorites.
