October Speaker: Chuck McClung

“A Strawberry is Not a Fruit”

Chuck McClung is a lifelong plant enthusiast and has been assisting gardeners for many years. He has a Master’s Degree in Botany and has worked in ecological research for a few universities. Chuck currently works as a gardening consultant, lecturer, and personal gardening mentor.

He is the author of:

How Orchids Rebloom, and his new book ***A Strawberry is not a Fruit*** was released this summer.

Come meet local botanist Chuck McClung as he discusses his new book ***A Strawberry is not a Fruit***, a collection of short essays on lesser-known ideas and perspectives from the world of plants.

Chuck will talk about various ideas related to plants and gardening, correct some common misconceptions about plants, and explain some of the topics covered in his new book, such as:

- * How to know your plant;
- * The difference between landscaping and vegetable gardening;
- * Why you cannot over-water a plant;
- * And, of course, why a strawberry is not a fruit.

Chuck will answer all your plant questions and remain after his presentation to sign copies of his new book.

Each week we bring in a new floral arrangement to share with the Ramona Community Library.


This brightens the Library, brings smiles to the people who see it and promotes our Garden Club to the citizens of Ramona.

Horticulture Table

We are making a push to fill up the Horticulture Table every month!!

In the morning before the meeting go out into your yard and look at what is growing there. Pick one, two or several different plants and bring to the meeting. Put them in a **clear** container (beer bottle, wine bottle or clear plain vase) with water. Fill out the Horticulture Tag and bring it to the meeting and set it on the table. **All horticulture must be grown by the exhibitor.**

The specimens can be flowers, leaves or even potted plants. You can also share fruit and vegetables that you are growing. We will be very casual with our plants so bring in everything you think looks good. This is mainly to share the wonderful plants you have in your yard.
