Tyler is the owner of San Diego "Backyard Fruit" and is an educator for many of our local nurseries. He was born in Arizona on a family farm. The love of fruit was in his blood from the start.

He has worked under Kurt Peacock, who has been a consulting Arborist and orchard specialist for over 30 years.

Also, Tom Spellman from Dave Wilson Nursery recruited him to teach his fruit tree classes and seminars. He eventually managed

the nursery where he began, and ran one of the most extensive fruit departments in California.

Tyler has since left the retail nursery scene to accommodate his growing customers and to expand "Backyard Fruit" to reach its full potential. With a main strategy of selecting trees to ripen at different times, he wants to help everyone select the very best varieties of fruit trees for their area, and help you solve local disease and pest problems with the least amount of effort.



Ramona Garden Club Field Trip for April Monday, April 14, 2025 Kumeyaay-Ipai Interpretative Center, Poway



The original native inhabitants of San Diego County, have lived in this region for at least 12,000 years. Historically, the Kumeyaay were experts at horticulture, hunting, gathering food and fibers, fire management, dam building, animal, and plant husbandry, creating watersheds and storing groundwater. Their territory spanned from just north of Oceanside, to well south of Ensenada and east to the Colorado river.

Many of the native plants used by the Kumeyaay for thousands of years, still grow throughout the county, including in many of our home gardens. Robert Holton is a docent at the center, and will be our guide for this unique opportunity. 
Chandler Herb Garden Volunteers
