KEEP ON SAVING YOUR POTS!!!

We are still collecting 1 gallon (mostly) and other size pots so members can propagate their plants from home. Bring them to the general meeting or drop them off at Collier Park in between the two

sheds! We also need unique containers for when we make the succulent gardens. Bring them to the meeting.





I'm happy to say I've seen Monarchs and other butterflies in my garden. Makes me smile. How about you?



March is perhaps the month in the year (in Ramona) which is most unpredictable. We all know about Spring, and how to tackle it. One way to combat this unpredictability is to start a journal of your garden. This is a good tool you can use to systematically improve your garden experience over the years. While you wait for something to note in your journal, there are a few things you can do.

- 1. Send a sample of your soil to a local county extension to have it tested to see what it may be lacking.
- 2. Don't walk on the soil because you may impact it due to excessive moisture, and this will impede root penetration and drainage.
- 3. Divide perennials that bloom in Autumn. Plant bulbs.
- 4. Fertilize your fruit trees.
- 5. Take action against the weeds.
- 6. Sow beets, corn, leafy crops, onions, arugula, chives, potatoes, squash and plants in the nightshade family.
- 7. Aerate mulch so plants can push up unimpeded and the ground can warm up.
