We love to have guests attend, so bring a friend or invite an acquaintance. First we will attend to new and old business; followed by our pot luck luncheon, guest speaker presentation, raffle and announcements. Make sure to visit our Horticulture Table and library of related books for check out. For the November POTLUCK, the RGC will provide a ham and ask that all the members bring side dishes or desserts. Those whose last name begins with the letters **M through Z**, please bring a side salad or appetizer; Members whose last name begins with **A through L**, please bring dessert. Coffee, tea & water, as usual, are provided by the club.



The speaker for the November 13th Ramona Garden Club meeting will be Ramona's own Marsha Cook who will be speaking about **Earth Friendly Gardens**.



Marsha is a native San Diegan who has lived in Ramona since 2001. She retired from public service in 2017, and has since increased her time spent on enjoying art and gardening. She became a Master Gardener in 2019. Marsha enjoys gardening with California -friendly plants, including Mediterranean varieties and California native plants.

Principles of earth-friendly gardens include: a) Selection of climate appropriate plants, b) Caring for the soil, c) Responsible pest management, d) Protecting wildlife, e) conserving water and water quality, f) Conserving energy and protecting air quality, g) Reducing waste and h) Growing food.

For residents who are already well on their way and already practicing these principles of "Earth Friendly Gardening," they may want to complete a checklist/survey about their practices, to self-certify they meet the minimum criteria. Residents who complete the checklist and meet the minimum requirements can print a certificate from the Master Gardeners webpage. For those who might enjoy purchasing and posting an "Earth Friendly Garden" aluminum sign on their property, a limited number of signs will be made available for purchase at the event. The purchase price is \$25, with proceeds from sale of the signs helping to support Master Gardener programs such as school gardens, community gardens, memory care gardening, and so much more!

May it be a blessed and delicious experience.



If you don't know the name of the plant, ask for identification and hopefully someone at the meeting will clue you in on what the plant is. Just include the words "PLEASE ID" on your tag. Extra tags should be available. It can be anything from flowers to leaves to potted plants or cuttings. So many beautiful plants grow here in Ramona all year long. 
