The farmstand was opened 2 years ago by Carole and her husband, Kevin who wanted to develop a “homestead lifestyle.” The farm cultivates fruit and vegetables, water wise

plants such as succulents and cacti, and are also beginning to cultivate Australian and South African plants like proteas and eucalyptus. The farmstand also carry's jams, dried fruit, and fresh eggs.
