


Chuck McClung, Author of How Orchids ReBloom

Mr. McClung, who has been described as "humorous," will teach us "<u>How Orchids Rebloom</u>," and has written a book with the same title. He has a master's degree in Botany, and has worked in landscape design, maintenance, and ecological research for many universities. 
