

## SAFARI PARK GARDEN VOLUNTEERS: HOW TO GET INVOLVED

If you are interested in volunteering with the Safari Park Gardens, please follow the steps below:

#### STEP 1:

Review Garden Descriptions: Review the garden descriptions and requirements on the first page of this document and decide which garden you are interested in volunteering with!

#### STEP 2:

Apply: Apply to volunteer online at <a href="https://sandiegozoowildlifealliance.org/jobs/volunteer-application">https://sandiegozoowildlifealliance.org/jobs/volunteer-application</a> and indicate that you are interested in volunteering with our gardens and which garden you would like to volunteer with. You can ignore the information about the Recruitment Window.

#### STEP 3:

Online Training: You will receive an email with instructions for Online Training, including a Website Scavenger Hunt, Orientation, Handbook Scavenger Hunt, Kulture City Sensitivity and Inclusion Training, and New Volunteer Paperwork. This process will take about 6-8 hours, and can be completed at your own pace.

#### STEP 4:

Connect with Lead Garden Volunteer: Once you complete your Online Training, you will be connected with the Lead Volunteer of your chosen garden. They will coordinate when your first shift will be and give you instructions for volunteering.

#### STEP 5:

Get Started!: When you come in for your first shift, we will provide you with your volunteer uniform and ID and ensure you have everything you need! Your Lead Garden Volunteer will take you through everything you need to know after that!

### Ramona Garden Club Horticulture Table RETURNS!

The Horticultural Table is back! Past President Maggie Crane started this fun sharing event at the Ramona Garden Club. Library Flowers Co-Chair Carol Bazinet is bringing this cool feature back to life! Please think about sharing what is blooming in your yard! Here are some instructions from Carol (and Maggie).

In the morning before the meeting, go out into your yard and look at what is growing there. Choose one, two or several different plants that you pick and bring to the meeting the next day. Put them in a clear container (beer bottle, wine bottle or clear plain vase) with water. Fill out the Horticulture Tag and bring it to the meeting and set it on the table. All plants must be grown by the exhibitor.



If you don't know the identification of the plant and want to find out, please bring it in and put one of the PLEASE ID tags that will be on the table by the plant and hopefully one of our members will know what it is. That way the next time you bring it in you will know what the plant is.

The specimens can be flowers, leaves, vegetables, fruit, annuals or perennials or even potted plants. We will be very casual with our plants for the first few months so bring in everything you think looks good. This is mainly to share the wonderful plants you have in your yard. While we do that, we will also be learning how to display Horticulture at a flower show and learning about lots of new plants, so it is a win-win activity.

I will have Horticulture Tags available at the Horticulture Table to fill out.
