Meet our 2025 Scholarship Recipients!



Hallie Bishop graduated from Ramona High School with a GPA of 4.13. Her favorite subjects are Science and English. Her mother works in the construction industry which exposed her to the ways industries work together to reduce construction's environmental footprint. After taking an advanced placement class in environmental science Hallie realized the far-reaching impact she could have by merging her passion with a career. After completing initial studies at Grossmont Community College in the Fall, she plans to pursue a degree in Environmental Science at USC Chico with the goal of becoming a sustainability manager.

Her achievements also include a gold medal in advanced construction at the regional Skills USA, followed by an invitation to compete at the National Level. The Ramona Sentinel wrote a nice article about this year's graduation it includes some of Liana's other interests.



Did You Know?

We all know that the Ramona Garden Club supports the Penny Pines Tree Reforestation project through donations at our monthly general meetings.

Did you know California's first Penny Pines plantation was sponsored by the San Francisco Sports-Women's Association in 1941?

Recognizing the great need to restore devastated forests, the association sent its donation to the Shasta-Trinity National Forest at the start of the program in 1941. Seedlings could be produced for about one cent each, and about 680 seedlings covered one acre. Today each \$68.00 donation provides support for one acre (one "plantation") which may include up to 350 trees.

The California Garden Club, Inc. adopted Penny Pines as a state project in 1957 and it remains one of the major projects today. Over the years, donations have contributed more than a million dollars to the Penny Pines Reforestation Program.

Through these donations, more than 27 million seedlings have been planted, renewing 88,000 acres of national forest land (such as the Cleveland National Forest) in California –truly an outstanding achievement.

So, at our next meeting, please consider donating as our Penny Pines project provides a helping hand. *It is a conservation program in which everyone can participate.*

As the Penny Pines Committee Chair, Diane McKee leads our effort in supporting this worthy cause.

At our June meeting we will be honoring members of our club with this year's donations.

Scholarship Presentation at Montecito High School





Happy 80th Birthday, Jane. We wish you many, many more wonderful years!


