
ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT 3D NANOBLADING

1. What, Exactly, is Nanoblading?

Most people have heard of microblading, small incisions placed in the brow area that mimics hairs, but what about nanoblading? Also referred to as nano brows, the procedure is essentially a semi-permanent tattoo that, when executed properly, results in fluffy, perfectly coiffed brows. Longer-lasting than microblading and suitable for oily and scarred skin, nanoblading presents an appealing new solution for over-plucked or otherwise high-maintenance eyebrows.

2. How Does it Work?

all nano brows are completely customized to each client's unique facial features and preferences. From start to finish, the procedure takes around three to four hours in total. "The first half of the appointment mostly consists of the initial consultation and brow design process. During this consultation, we'll discuss the client's desired brow shape and size, and pigment colors that complement their skin. A client's skin type is also assessed in order to determine whether more technical skill is required (thicker, oilier skin is more

difficult to tattoo). The artist then pre-draws each eyebrow hair using a sharp, flat-edged pencil. The completed design is then shown to the client for final approval.

"The second half consists of the cosmetic tattooing procedure. A single moving needle

and machine is used to slowly implant pigment into the skin. This process can take some time, as each individual stroke is meticulously drawn using the tattoo machine." Once cosmetic tattooing is completed, the client and artist consult on any additions. "If the goal is a much darker, fuller or fluffier brow, this can be done by layering more nano strokes at a follow-up appointment so as to not overwork the skin.

3. That Sounds Painful. Does it Hurt?

Don't worry it's not painful but may cause slight discomfort. Before nanoblading begins, your brows are treated with a numbing ointment to reduce any pain. The level of discomfort is similar to eyebrow threading. Overall, nanoblading is no worse than regular waxing or plucking.

4. How Long Does it Take?

The procedure can take up to four -four1/2 hours.

This is because there are several stages involved in nanoblading. The desired shape, arch, and thickness of the brows have to first be outlined and drawn in before the actual nanoblading can begin. This is to ensure that things look exactly the way you want them to. It's a delicate process that requires precision and attention to detail.

5. What Happens After?

In short, yes. Nano brows are cosmetic tattoos, so expect some minor redness and swelling for a day or two post-application as your skin heals. Clients need to understand that keeping fresh nano brows clean by regularly blotting the area with a damp paper towel or a sterile water wipe, and then gently patting dry. "This will help remove any excess buildup of lymph, pigment or oil to reduce the amount of scabbing that occurs," You should avoid sweating, swimming, sun exposure and applying any skincare products to the brow area for one week. It will begin to lightly peel around day three, and last for up to four days total. Any peeling skin should not be picked at

or scrubbed — instead, let the skin flake off naturally. "Once your brows have completely healed, it's a good idea to continue to avoid using chemical exfoliants directly on your brow area and to protect them with SPF to keep them lasting longer!" she concludes.

6. How Long Does it Last?

The results of nanoblading usually last between 2 and 3 years. Because it's semi-permanent, the pigment will eventually fade. You should consider going in for a touch-up after 12 months. Nanoblading does require a touchup 4-6 weeks after the initial procedure.

That's more than 365 days where you won't have to touch a brow pencil or brush.

7. Who Should Get Nanoblading?

Nanoblading is for those who want to redefine their eyebrows. Whether you have naturally thin brows, or your brow-ends are fading with age, nanoblading has the ability to add volume and color to your eyebrows. Nanoblading can also reshape your brows, adding more angle to your arch or more detail to your ends.

Individuals taking blood thinners

If any skin diseases symptoms or irritation appears on the particular area (eyebrows)

Directly after Botox treatment (after 1 or 2 months it is allowed)

If you are using Accutane, Isotretinoin or other strong retinoids (after 6 months it is allowed)

If you are have a pacemaker (not allowed for machine technique, but allowed for manual technique)

If you are suffering a sunburn or frostbite (treatment is allowed after symptoms disappear)
