2024 Cobb County Metro League Tie-Breakers

- 1. Cumulative head to head record in games involving tied teams. (Cumulative because it may involve more than 1 team)
 - a. Example:
 - i. Team A, B, and C are tied for 4th place
 - 1. Team A is 1-0 vs. B and 0-1 vs. C = 1-1 cumulative
 - 2. Team B is 0-1 vs. A and 0-1 vs. C = 0-2 cumulative
 - 3. Team C is 1-0 vs B and 1-0 vs A = 2-0 cumulative
 - b. In the scenario provided, team C would clinch the 4th seed
 - c. Team A and B would then be tied for 5th. We would evaluate their record head to head to determine 5th place.
- 2. Teams win / loss record against the highest seeded team. (If record against highest seeded team is the same, go to next highest seeded team all the way through all teams)
- 3. Cumulative runs allowed in games played between tied teams
 - Example 1: if there was a 3 way tie for a placing (example: 1st place)
 - Team A beat team B 4-0
 - Team A lost to team C 6-2
 - o Team B beat team C 7-1
 - Team A allowed 6 runs cumulatively
 - Team B allowed 5 runs cumulatively
 - Team C allowed 9 runs cumulatively

Team $B = 1^{st}$ Team $A = 2^{nd}$ Team C = 3rd

• Example 2: Team A and B are tied for a placing (for example 1st place)

Game 1 A defeated B 3-2 Game 2 B defeated A 6 – 1

A allowed: 8 runs B allowed: 4 runs

B = 1st A = 2nd

- 4. Runs allowed against highest seeded team (If record against highest seeded team is the same, go to next highest seeded team all the way through all teams)
- 5. Cumulative runs allowed in all region games played.

6. Cumulative run differential in region games. (largest differential is tie breaker)
****If there is more than a two way tie and any team is knocked out or secures a seeding due to the criteria stated in the rules, tie breakers start over at 1******
