LESSON 6

Know That The Wounded Need Your Help

Luke 10:25-37

INTRODUCTION

The world is full of wounded people with no one to help. They are wounded and left for dead. I am not just referring to someone who has been shot but the wounded can be in many forms. A wounded person may be someone grieving the loss of a love one. The wounded may be someone picking up the fragments from a bitter divorce. The wounded may be someone who is homeless with no where to go, no food, and no clothes. Whatever situation a wounded person may be in, it provides us with a golden opportunity to render some kind of assistance. In today's times it is risky at times, to render help to the wounded. Helping people is always risky. People have been hurt and sometimes killed being the good Samaritan. As we continue to go through this Covid 19 Pandemic we are seeing more and more wounded people. We cannot help everybody; but we should be able to help somebody. In today's lesson we are going to see a perfect biblical example of a neighbor who helped another wounded neighbor.

1st Reading-Luke 10:25.....A Tricky Question With A Trap

- A. A certain lawyer (Notice Luke's use of the word "certain"- a common word)
- B. Motive expressed: Tempted him (Jesus)
- C. Respect shown-Master or teacher
- D. The Question: What I do to inherit eternal life?

2nd Reading-Luke 10:26.....Jesus Addresses The Question With A Question

- A. Jesus sees the lawyer's motive.
- B. Question: What is written in the law? (A lawyer should know the answer}
- C. Question 2: How do you read? Or how do you understand?

3rd Reading- Luke 10:27.....The Lawyers Response

- A. Love the Lord God with all your heart, soul, strength and mind
- B. Love thy neighbor as thyself.

4th Reading-Luke 10:28.....Jesus Affirmative Response

- A. You answered correctly. (Answered your own question)
- B. Jesus' directive: Do this and you shall live.

5th Reading- Luke 10:29.....Mission Unaccomplished-The Lawyer Presses His Issue

- A. Self-justification seen by Luke and Jesus
- B. Another Question from the lawyer: But who is my neighbor

6th Reading-Luke 10:30-32-.....Parable of the Wounded Neighbor

- A. Again Luke uses the phrase, “a certain man.”
- B. Went down from Jerusalem to Jericho
- C. The plight of the neighbor
 - ❖ beaten,
 - ❖ stripped,
 - ❖ robbed,
 - ❖ left for dead
- D. Two passers by
 - ❖ A priest-Synagogue official looked and passed by
 - ❖ A Levite- Synagogue official- Looked and passed by

7th Reading- Luke 10:33-35.....The Samaritan: On Neighbor Helping Another Neighbor

- A. The first four words of verse stands out in the affirmative: “But a certain Samaritan.....”
- B. Actions of the Samaritan:
 - ❖ Saw him
 - ❖ Stopped
 - ❖ Showed compassion
 - ❖ Bound up his wounds,
 - ❖ Pouring in oil and wine
 - ❖ Set him on his own beast
 - ❖ Brought him to an inn
 - ❖ Took care of him
- C. Provision for follow-up care-The extra mile
 - ❖ Paid for inn stay
 - ❖ Proposed to pay for extended time

8th Reading- Luke 10:36-37.....Jesus’s Question To The Lawyer: Who Was The Real Neighbor?

- A. Jesus Loaded Question: Which now of these three, was the neighbor to the wounded man?
- B. The lawyer’s response: “He that showed mercy.”
- C. Jesus final directive: “Go and do likewise.” (Case closed!!)



Spiritual Applications of The Lesson

1. When it comes to helping the wounded we should pray and be led by the Lord.
2. Sometimes God will allow wounded people to cross our path as a test.
3. Helping the wounded has present and eternal rewards.
4. We will never know when someone must rescue us from a life-threatening situation
