## **Know That The Wounded Need Your Help Luke 10:25-37**

#### INTRODUCTION

The world is full of wounded people with no one to help. They are wounded and left for dead. I am not just referring to someone who has been shot but the wounded can be in many forms. A wounded person may be someone grieving the loss of a love one. The wounded may be someone picking up the fragments from a bitter divorce. The wounded may be someone who is homeless with no where to go, no food, and no clothes. Whatever situation a wounded person may be in, it provides us with a golden opportunity to render some kind of assistance. In today's times it is risky at times, to render help to the wounded. Helping people is always risky. People have been hurt and sometimes killed being the good Samaritan. As we continue to go through this Covid 19 Pandemic we are seeing more and more wounded people. We cannot help everybody; but we should be able to help somebody. In today's lesson we are going to see a perfect biblical example of a neighbor who helped another wounded neighbor.
