Voting Timeline: 2026 Primary

December 17

Apply for Vote By Mail
First day to apply for a vote by mail ballot for the 2026 General Primary Election

January 2

UOCAVA Application
First day for persons outside the country to apply for Vote by Mail ballot

February 5

Voting by Mail Begins
First day for the election authority to mail an official ballot

February 18

Grace Period Registration and Voting Begins
First day of grace period registration and voting at the office of the election authority or at a location designated

February 5

Early Voting Begins
First day for early voting at the office of the election authority and at any additional locations

February 17

Close of Voter Registration
Last day for regular registration or transfer of registration

March 1

Online Voter Registration Closes
Last day for online voter registration

March 12

Last Day to Mail Vote by Mail Ballots
Last day for the election authority to receive, by mail, an application for a vote by mail ballot

Early Voting begins in less than two weeks, on Feb 5th. We're sorry, we don't have a sample ballot yet. The official one hasn't been released yet. Eventually, it will be posted on our Stephenson County Clerks website here. Click the underlined text.

It's not a fault of our County Clerk. There are still a few candidates whose petitions have been challenged and the final decisions have not been announced.

We have some yard signs and campaign literature in the office but not for every candidate. This is not because we haven't asked for it. Please keep in mind that candidates have a responsibility to get their information out to the public and into our hands. They don't always succeed getting their campaign literature and signs to us. We will keep asking.

Important changes if you Vote by Mail

The postmark rules have changed for your mail in ballot!

IMPORTANT POSTMARK CHANGES

What Vote by Mail Voters Need to Know



Mail Postmark Rules Have Changed

Previously: Mail was postmarked the day you mailed it

Now: Mail is postmarked **the day it is processed** which can result in **at least a 1-2 day delay**

VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS

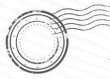
Must be Postmarked by Election Day to be Counted

A late postmark will **NOT** be counted



Mailing Your Ballot Close to Election Day?

If you are returning your ballot within a week of or on Election Day:



Go to the post office counter & request a **manual postmark**



Use a **secure drop box** (if available)



Deliver your ballot directly to your **election authority's office**

DON'T RISK A LATE POSTMARK

Take one extra step to make sure **YOUR VOTE COUNTS!**

Check with your election authority for drop box locations and office hours

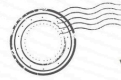
Debe llevar matasellos del día de las elecciones para ser válido

¿Vas a enviar tu voto por correo cerca del día de las elecciones?

Si devuelves tu papeleta dentro de la semana previa o el mismo día de las elecciones:



Acude al mostrador de Correos y pide un **matasellos manual**



Utiliza una **urna segura** (si está disponible)



Entrega tu papeleta directamente en la **oficina electoral correspondiente**

No pongas en riesgo tu voto por un matasellos tardío
Da un paso más para asegurar que TU VOTO CUENTE

Consulta con tu autoridad electoral las ubicaciones de buzones y el horario de atención



USPS POSTMARK CHANGE

STARTING DEC 24, 2025

OLD WAY
(Before Dec 24, 2025)

Postmark = Day of Drop-off
(e.g., Dec 27)

NEW WAY
(Starting Dec 24, 2025)

Postmark = Day of Processing
(e.g., Dec 28, 29... +1-2 Days Delay)

CRITICAL FOR DEADLINES (Taxes, Ballots, etc.)

IF YOU NEED SAME-DAY POSTMARK:
Go to the USPS Counter & Request a Manual Postmark!
