Tips for choosing a Rock Pick

Here are some quick tips for choosing the right rock pick:

Consider the weight – Lighter picks are easier to carry, but heavier ones break rocks faster.

Look at the grip — A comfortable grip makes a huge difference after a long day of digging.

Think about what you'll use it for –

Hardcore fossil hunting? General rockhounding? Prospecting? Pick one that matches your needs. A good rock pick makes all the difference. Also, don't forget safety goggles to protect yourself from flying rock pieces. You don't need to buy anything fancy. Invest in a quality tool, and you'll enjoy rockhounding even more.



Estwing IO-22P is a good all around choice.

Ballots for next year's board will be sent out this summer. There are 3 board positions available.


Asking for ideas for next year's Fair.
