Mineral of the Month: Tsavorite Garnet!

Tsavorite is a green gem variety of grossular garnet. It was first found in 1967 in northern Tanzania and again in 1970 in Kenya's Tsavo National Park by noted geologist Campbell Bridges. These green rocks received a prestigious boost when Tiffany & Co. began using them in its jewelry, starting in the mid-70s. It continues to be mined in a remote bushland that's home to lions and volcanoes. "It's a very often looked over stone because it's a garnet, and most people associate garnet with the inexpensive

red variety," Hyman noted. "But these green tsavorites in larger sizes are extremely rare and beautiful, and are just as hard, or harder, than emerald."
Tsavorite garnet ranks 7 to a 7.5 for Mohs hardness.
You're unlikely to find tsavorites in sizes that are larger than 2.5 carats.

"The color that's been popular lately in the market is a minty color tsavorite. There's an area called Merelani in Tanzania where they're found," he said.

The sign on the side of the road says "Falling Rock", and you pull over to wait.


