Tips When Working with Gems

-When mounting a cab and you're not sure of the size, take the mounting, press the bezel on a stamp pad and then transfer to a card. Now you have the outline of the opening. Cut out and use the opening as you would a template.



-Remember do not put water filled stones, such as opals in the freezer to remove the cab from the dipstick.

The water will freeze and crack the stone.

-To keep opals, put a few drops of rubbing alcohol in the bottles of water in which they are kept. It will keep them from turning black and the water from getting stagnant.

Because it couldn't "leaf" its friends behind!


