Program for the evening was on putting in Blue Ribbon Showcase entries at the upcoming Riverside County Fair and Date festival by Peggy Richard.


Congratulations to our raffle winner of the evening, Susana Velazquez. The meeting adjourned at about 7:30 p.m.

January 16, 2024 - Board Meeting Minutes

Club member expansion was

discussed. Ideas given this evening were to make flyers available at meetings for people to give out to others about our club and also for members to call and reach out to members who have been absent. Also, we will plan to get some classes going in March or April as time allows. This will be an ongoing topic at future meetings.

The board approved a Rock Sale on club property on Saturday, March 23rd from 9 am to 3 pm.
