Petrified Wood Show and Tell

A presentation by Bob Fitzpatrick at Club Meeting June 6, 2023

Bob took us on an armchair adventure when he took us back to April 14, 2006, to revisit a site he termed "The Ranch" a sweet spot for petrified wood located outside of Petrified National Forest. Special arrangements were made with the ranch owner to see undisturbed petrified wood deposits including full trees. Merely a ten-hour drive for him, from Beaumont to west Arizona's town of Holbrook, Bob described meeting up with over fifty people from several different

locations. After gathering and paying an entrance fee they joined a caravan to Dinosaur Park, a huge cattle ranch with an abundance of petrified wood 225 million years old. In only forty-five minutes of driving, they arrived at the first collecting area, rich in petrified wood. Along with his travel partner Ken Baron, Bob loaded his truck with beautiful pieces, large and small, of petrified wood. Bob passed around pictures and specimens. His last stop was Jim Gray's rock shop where

Bob felt "like a kid in a candy store." When asked, "Did he need to go to the Petrified Forest? Bob replied, 'No, we did not need to, it's like we were in it!"
