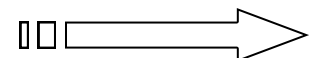
From the President:

Meanwhile:

Bruce, Mark and Judy have been diligently keeping our Pool and Rec Center Compound in good working order.

A new Air Conditioning unit was installed for the Artist Alcove, Kitchen, and both Shower/Change rooms. They are persistently working to get the temperatures regulated so all 4 rooms are equal and comfortable.

The back access gate has to be changed out to meet County pool safety code. Quotes are being gathered at this time. There should be more information on this project in next month's Clip Board.

The group trims trees and brush, rakes under trees, fixes things, plants and takes care of flowers, makes trips to the dump and spreads landscape rock, cleans up the La Canada frontage and the San Ignacio island and anything else Ken can come up with.

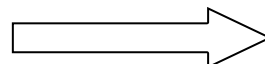

The goal is to keep the rock banks free of weeds and most growth because the pack rats, ants and all sorts of animals like to live there and by their burrowing bring up the sand destroying the effectiveness of the rock banks.

Architectural & Compliance

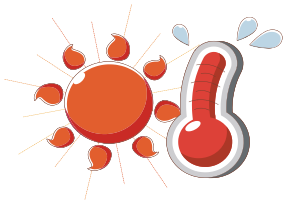
Tony Gleadhill has agreed to Chair the Architectural Committee. He is reviewing and re-organizing the current process, seeking to make it more efficient and effective.

SERIOUS COMPLIANCE POINTS TO REMEMBER:

- ⇒ **Parking on the gravel in front of or next to your house is prohibited by the CC&R's.**
- ⇒ **Mailboxes & Lamp Posts are to be painted BLACK.**
- ⇒ **1/2 of the alleyway behind free standing homes is the Home owners' responsibility to keep clean/weeded**
- ⇒ **Front & side yards also need to be kept free of weeds, debris and overgrown bushes & trees.**
- ⇒ **Carports & front entrance areas need to be kept clear of Unsightly Articles.**

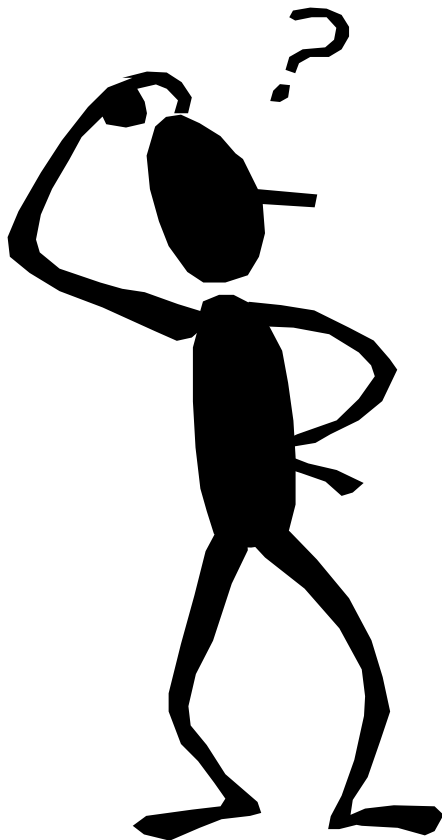
