Maintenance Report

- 1. We have gotten some new chaise lounges around the pool. They are in sizes large and extra large so try them and see which fits best. There are also a couple of sun chaise lounges for the tanners in the crowd.
- 2. We also have a new poll heater, according to the service guy the old one lasted about 50% longer than is typical in a commercial pool system. We're going to try to get even more life out of this one.
- 3. Rec Center trim has painted in a new color. The brick decking around the fountain has also been repainted.
- 4. The pool table has gotten a tune-up and is much better for playing pool now.
- 5. We now have a NuStep semi-recumbent exercise machine. It is good for general aerobic exercise as well as a pre and post operation conditioning.
- 6. Several relatively minor issues have been dealt with. The flagpole has been re-engineered with the goal of the pole not getting quite so funky looking.

Compliance

I received 3 compliance issue requests. One is pending follow-up and one is resolved. The third involved a trail maintenance issue and is in the process of being resolved.

COMPLIANCE POINTS TO KEEP IN MIND

- Front & side yards are to be kept free of weeds, debris & overgrown bushes & trees.
- Half of the alleyway behind free standing homes is the home owners' responsibility to keep clear of weeds and debris.
- Carports, front entrance areas & side yards need to be kept clear
 of unsightly articles. Pack rats love hiding places but your
 neighbors may not like the pack rats.
- Mailboxes & Lamp Posts are to be painted black. Lamp Post lights are to remain in working order. So please check your Lamp Post from time to time and make sure the 'Light is still working.' If you are a snowbird, please have a neighbor keep an eye out for your Lamp Post for you.
- Parking on the gravel in front of or next to your house is prohibited by the CC&R's.




The following
