

Pool News

We continue to experience an increase in children's toy parts in the pool equipment such as drains, spa plumbing, pumps etc. Almost certainly these 'parts' come from the toys, necklaces and bracelets young guests bring to the pool. These parts do cause significant damage to pool equipment AND in some cases cost the Association thousands of dollars to repair. Not to mention potential downtime when the pool is unavailable for all to use.

As a reminder, no pool user, particularly children, are permitted to use toys or wear necklaces and bracelets in the pool. If it is observed, the person or persons will be asked to leave. A resident who has guest children using the pool is responsible for those children and is liable for costs incurred by the Association to repair any damage resulting from failure to follow the above.

Speeding

It has been reported to the Board that some residents enter and leave cul-de-sac 13, which serves the west parking lot, at an *excessive speed*. Residents on the cul-de-sac walk or gather on the paved area. It is important to remember we are a senior community. Not all of us are as sprightly as we once were. To a senior, using a walker/cane, any vehicle represents a concern. Add vehicle speed in a confined space only increases that concern. If you use the west parking lot, please keep your vehicle speed to 10mph or less when entering or exiting the cul-de-sac. It only adds a few seconds to your journey!
