Wayne Gretzky has won the most MVP awards of all the players in North American men's sports leagues, with a total of nine. His uniform #99 has been retired throughout the National Hockey League. The honor of having his number retired throughout an entire league has only ever been achieved by one other athlete, Jackie Robinson (#42).

The word Jeep comes from the phonetic sound of the abbreviation "G.P.," a military term which stands for "general purpose" vehicle.
