

To close out our year, today we salute a man who has been diligent in taking care of our investments and steadfastly engages in the life of the church through his efforts on the Church Council.





In addition to my visitations to our shut-ins, I participated in the wedding of Brandi Adams this past Friday.

- We are gearing up for the Totem Fest Service on the 21st where we will remember those members who have passed on this year.
- The Clothes Closet has had steady customers these past weeks and donations keep coming in. A plea has been put out for more volunteers as we only have the same two people doing the closet each week and I'm sure they would like a break.
- Our Bible Study continues on Tuesdays and we are starting to study the New Testament the Book of Matthew this coming Tuesday. Those who are interested can join us.
- I would like to see us, as a Council, plus any others interested, have a mini retreat at the church perhaps on a Saturday morning to engage in a discussion about where we are as church and what we think will be happening in the future and ideas as to what we can do. I I really think we need to prayerfully think about doing this to find what ways we can not only survive but maybe thrive as a congregation. I would suggest we do this sometime in January.
- I would also like us to consider either getting different hymnals for worship or signing up fpr a license to print more standard hymns in our bulletins. Too many of the well-known hymns have had their words changed in this hymnal and some have had different tunes from what people have been used to. There are some excellent hymnals out there which have some new material but maintain the old standards and we could discuss this at another meeting, if you are interested.
