Changes to Household Waste collections

Changes are coming to household waste collections early this year. The changes are designed to make it easier to recycle household waste, and also will reduce the number of collection vehicles required — reducing the carbon footprint of household waste collections. Currently separate trucks collect the black and blue-lidded boxes. Once the changes come in, one lorry will collect both, nearly halving the carbon footprint of collections (not to mention fuel bills!)

Once the changes are implemented, the Once service changes have commenced, residents will be able to put more materials into the blue lidded bin:

- plastic bottles
- •plastic pots (including yoghurt), tubs (such as margarine, ice cream) and trays (from products such as fruit, meat, vegetables)
- cardboard
- •food and drink cartons (for example soup, milk, fruit juice)
- •shredded paper (placed inside an envelope or cardboard box)
- tins and cans
- •clean foil
- empty aerosols
- paper (including brown paper, newspapers, magazines, directories, catalogues, envelopes)

As before, Black plastic and flower pots are not collected for recycling at the kerbside. However these items can be taking to Household Recycling Centres. Retailers are beginning to reduce the use of black plastic trays for foodstuffs due to the difficulty in recycling them, which is a welcome step.

Black boxes can continue to be used for:

- glass bottles and jars
- •clean and dry textiles (for example clothes, paired shoes, curtains, sheets, blankets) bagged and tied

Collections will remain fortnightly, as they currently are (ie household waste one week, with recycling the other on a rotating cycle). Some residents may have changes to their collection days, but any changes will be communicated to residents directly.

More information will become available via social media, website, leaflets and email before any changes are implemented.

All homes will receive a personalised letter detailing what, if any, changes there will be to collection days.

Green Johanna hot composter

Wiltshire Council has a long-running scheme offering "Green Johanna" hot composters at a greatly subsidised cost (£50 when bought through the Council – RRP is £128!). These composters are a great way

of reducing the amount of food waste going into general waste bins, and are far more sustainable than carrying out kerbside food waste collections. More information about this

Joint Strategic Needs Assessment update

You may recall the short JSNA survey that took place in the Autumn of 2019. This surveyed community areas across the county and I was very keen to ensure that as many people as possible in our area took part. I am delighted that our community area of Bradford-on-Avon and Villages had the highest response of any community area in Wiltshire. The next stage of the process will be in the Spring of this year when a JSNA event will take place to analyse the survey outcomes in more detail and to use them to help set out priorities as a community area for the next three years. I will continue to keep the Parish Council and community updated on this process to ensure our priorities feed into this process.

Compostable and recyclable parking ticket pouches....

They're a sight that no motorist wants to see, but from 2 January 2020, all Wiltshire Council penalty charge notice bags will be both biodegradable and recyclable.

The new bags comply with BS EN 13432 standards for compostability, which ensures a minimum of 90% biological degradation within six months, and a minimum of 90% physical degradation within 12 weeks. The bags also do not contribute to the decline of composted material quality, as established via ecotoxicity tests – this means you can pop them in your subsidised Green Johanna composter from Wiltshire Council! (See above!)
