Clean air decision delayed

It could be some time before we learn of any potential impact on our community of Bath's Clean Air Zone proposals. A decision on the proposals, which was due to be announced on December 18, has been delayed.

An astonishing 8,400 responses to the six-week consultation process were received by Bath & North East Somerset Council by the November deadline, resulting in officers asking the Government for more time to give proper consideration to the unprecedented high number of responses received and to carry out further technical work. B&NES is aiming to produce an updated report in March.

Middle Stoke road closure

Part of **Middle Stoke** will be closed temporarily on **Monday, February 4**, from outside property No. 52 for a distance of approximately 100 metres, to enable Wessex Water to replace a communication pipe relay.

The closure may be required until **February 8** (depending on the weather) and delays are likely. Further details from Wessex Water on 0345 600 4600.

Galleries stats

Last year, 50,000 customers passed through the doors of the Galleries Shop and Café, where 225,000 items were purchased throughout the year, including 4,000 boxes of eggs; 12,000 litres of milk; 750kg of bananas and 600kg of tomatoes.

Customers polished off 10,000 croissants, washed down with 17,000 cups of coffee and 3,000 cups of tea.



Newspaper sales show that 5,000 copies of The Times and 3,000 copies of The Telegraph were sold during the year.
