

Cars could be exempt from 'clean air' charge



Car drivers might not have to pay to enter Bath's proposed Clean Air Zone, should a revised plan be approved by Bath & North East Somerset Council. An 'unprecedented' number of responses (over 8,400) were received to B&NES' public consultation, thereby delaying a decision due at the end of last year.

All higher emission vehicles, including cars, were to have been charged to enter the Clean Air Zone, but latest forecasts show Government carbon emission reduction targets would still be met if the fees were restricted to taxis, buses, coaches, lorries and vans.

Officers have now recommended the adoption of a revised scheme to exempt cars from the charges, while public feedback has also shaped a number of changes to the original zone boundary. These changes could be approved by councillors at a meeting at 10am on **Tuesday, March 5** at Bath's Guildhall.



Local woodland saved

The Woodland Trust, the UK's largest woodland conservation charity, has been successful in raising the £355,000 needed to purchase 48 acres of ancient Avoncliff Wood, thanks to the generosity of everyone who donated to its recent appeal (*report, Limpley Stoke News Dec 2018*) and support from the Nationwide Building Society.

Twenty-six acres of adjacent land, where a wildlife-rich buffer of trees and open spaces will be created, have also been secured.

The wood, which lies adjacent to the riverside walk between Freshford and Avoncliff, is not currently open to the public.

One of the Trust's first tasks will be to carry out environmental surveys to uncover what lies within this important habitat, which has been left untouched for generations.

Local villagers and schools will be encouraged to get involved with planting trees and shaping the future of this unique woodland on our doorstep.

Political areas set to change

Wiltshire's political areas are set to be re-shaped as boundaries between some communities change. New homes and more people moving to the county mean the areas represented by Wiltshire Council's 98 councillors will change as towns continue to grow.

The Local Government Boundary Commission has launched a 10-week public consultation and wants to hear your views on the recommendations before **Monday, April 15**.

Richard Clewer, chairman of Wiltshire Council's Electoral Review Committee, said: "I'd encourage people to get involved in this consultation, as the final outcome will have an impact on communities up and down the county. Things will not stay the same as they are, so I hope people take a look and see how it could affect their local area."

A final decision will be published in July.

Raise funds for air ambulance

Last month's *Limpley Stoke News* reported on the increasing running costs of the Wiltshire Air Ambulance (WAA) and how the charity relies on donations and fund-raising. So, if you or someone you know would like to take on a new and exciting challenge, then WAA has a choice of events.

How about the thrill of a 200ft controlled abseil down the Avon Gorge on **Sunday, April 14**, or a skydive (in tandem with a professional instructor) at Old Sarum airfield, near Salisbury, on **Sunday, June 2**. The Snowdon triple challenge on **Saturday, June 8** involves cycling, climbing and kayaking in Snowdonia National Park.

It costs £3.75 million a year to keep the air ambulance flying. WAA is not funded directly by the Government and receives no National Lottery grants. Wiltshire's Police and Crime Panel has voted to increase its precept by £24 for 2019/20.

This means the cost for the average Band D property will increase from £15.19 to £17.19 per month. The extra cash will allow for the recruitment of 41 more police officers, a number of them for community policing teams.
