To this end, members of the public are being encouraged to take part in the **Nation's Toast to the Heroes of World War 2 at 3pm on Friday, May 8,** as a thank you to those who gave their lives for this country.

Sue said: "After deciding to join the 'Scrubs for the NHS' Bath Facebook group, I've had a wonderful selection of unwanted bedding delivered to me following my recent request in the LiFERAFT Weekly News.

"From flowers to checks to planets, your generosity in donating bedding material has meant that I had far more than I could ever use, so it's now been distributed far and wide to be transformed into laundry bags, hats and scrubs. With more in the pipeline, don't be too surprised if you see someone wearing your old bedding. A big thank you to all involved", she added.

A team of eight have been working away at their sewing machines and were very proud to be able to deliver 14 pairs of scrubs and 14 bags for distribution to local doctors' surgeries. Good work, team.

Garden waste

Wiltshire Council has delayed renewal of subscriptions to the chargeable garden waste collection service, due to the pressures on services caused by COVID-19. The subscription renewal period will now not begin until **June 15** this year and customers who have already paid should continue to have their garden waste collected until June 30.

Collections of garden waste will continue, provided the council's contractor has sufficient staff to maintain service delivery, given the risk of absence as some staff need to self-isolate. Several neighbouring local authorities have already suspended their garden waste collections.

Clean air zone on hold

Bath's clean air zone, which was due to go live this November, has been put on hold due to the coronavirus crisis. B&NES Council has been advised by the Government to delay the start date to January 2021 at the earliest.

Limpley Stoke woods



Former Limpley Stoke resident, Jane Goodwin, writes:

"Did you know that Limpley Stoke woods contain plants which indicate ancient woodland? Forming part of the wildlife corridor extending down to Monkton Combe and the Midford valley, they can be accessed via the public footpath running from the A36 to Waterhouse Lane. The woods are a valuable wildlife resource and a recognised 'Wiltshire Wildlife Area'.

Walkers may have spotted the odd 'Private' notice appearing recently. There has been no need to do this before but other owners of the woodland and I are keen to direct walkers to keep to the footpath so as to avoid breeding birds, including ground-nesters.

Plans for maintenance and restoration of my bit will be put forward, once we are able to get out more, but my priority at the moment is to keep the footpath open. Please beware of branches falling from the odd ash tree near the path, especially when the winds come.

I am indebted to Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, Cotswold Wardens and other volunteers, as well as my family, who have helped to maintain and protect spaces for the wildlife to flourish over the years."

The caller, who had the resident's surname, claimed the offer was displayed on NatWest's information pages (although nothing about the 'service' appears there) and the number dialled from, supposedly in Bristol, is not listed. **Please be alert to these calls.**
