Chairman stands down

Peter Wyatt is stepping down as chairman of Limpley Stoke Parish Council. Peter joined the Council in June 2011, becoming vice-chairman in 2012 and taking over as chairman in 2015.

One of Peter's first tasks was the completion of work on the

King George V play park shelter project, which came about following a survey



completed by more than 100 children and parents on park improvements.

As chairman, Peter played a significant role in bringing about the joint Limpley Stoke and Freshford Neighbourhood Plan, the first cross-border plan in the country. The process to bring it to fruition, which had begun in 2012, required considerable commitment from many members of the community, with residents voting in favour of the Plan in a referendum held in the two villages in 2015.

Taking over as chairman is Anthony Gennard (see page 2).

D-Day service to honour local soldier

special service at the village war memorial at 11am on Thursday, June 6 – the 75th anniversary of D-Day – will commemorate Royal Engineer Corporal John Pike from Limpley Stoke, who was killed on the first day of the invasion.

Corporal Pike is the only local serviceman to be commemorated on the village war memorial and St Mary's Church roll-ofhonour board as having perished in the Second World War.

New chairman takes the helm

Anthony Gennard has been voted in as new chairman of Limpley Stoke Parish Council.

He ioined the Parish Council last June and had been serving as vicechairman.



Anthony moved to the village with his wife Joanne and two children in 2016, following a 24year career in the Royal Navy, and is now employed as a management consultant in the defence and security environment.

Since joining the Parish Council, his efforts have been focused on achieving the re-listing of the Hop Pole as an Asset of Community Value; the creation of a new Limpley Stoke website; and management of the play park.

Over the next 12 months, Anthony is keen to re-focus efforts around our Neighbourhood Plan. Driven by a sense of community, he says we wants to make our village a safer place to walk by tackling speeding. He believes that creating more opportunities for community engagement, from Film Club to Village Hall suppers, is central to success and that we must also make the most of our communications, keeping people informed through our monthly Limpley Stoke News and our new village website. "I'm looking forward to getting to know as many people as possible and helping to keep Limpley Stoke a great place to live", he added.

Game helps air ambulance

new mobile game created for Wiltshire Air Ambulance will help the county's life-saving charity attract support in a fun way.

Developers at Bradford on Avon-based OJO Solutions have donated £15,000 worth of studio time to build the app which launched last month.

Competitors playing the game, called Helifun, need to keep their helicopter up in the air as long as



possible, avoiding obstacles along the way, which brings the work of paramedics, pilots and fund-raising staff to life. The longer you fly the more points you earn.

Helifun is available to play on the Wiltshire Air Ambulance website (https://www.wiltshireairambulance.co.uk/helifun) and to download as a free app from the Apple Store or Google Play Store.

It costs £3.75 million per year to keep the air ambulance flying and saving lives. It is operational 365 days a year and able to reach incidents anywhere in the county within minutes.

Staying safe

Dorset & Wiltshire Fire Service has a dedicated adviser covering the Bradford on Avon area who can visit people in their own homes to advise on home safety and well-being.

The visit is free of charge and usually lasts about an hour, covering topics such as what to do if there is a fire; making an escape plan; keeping children out of harm; and using electricity safely.
