### First Fruits of Worship

### Why Worship? 4 Part Series



We all have different uses of the word "worship". It's a verb – "Let's go and worship!" It's a noun – "Let's go TO worship!" Worship is often confined to a building on one day out of the week. The word worship can divide people on the basis of style and content. But those are the peripheral issues involving worship. We are missing the most critical question of all – Why Worship? Why do we do it? What are the benefits?

This 4 part series on the benefits of worship are meant to highlight why we were created to worship. Worship is not for God's benefit. He's not on some colossal, universal ego trip and in need of millions of people to tell Him how great He is. No, we were created to worship because God designed us to need and benefit from worship. Think of worship as medicine for our soul. Just as we need blood pressure or heart

medicine for our physical bodies, we need the medicine of worship for our spirits and souls. So, let's begin by looking at the benefits of this holy medicine for our lives...

### Worship "Lifts"...

1. **Our Heads** - We spend a great deal of our time on this earth looking at our metaphorical "shoes". The world and it's earthly concerns cause us to lose our gaze at our heavenly father, and as a result we are focused downward. We're not going to find the answers to our life challenges on our shoes! King David wrote in Psalm 24:

### "Lift up your heads, you mighty gates; be lifted up, you ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in." Psalm 24:7

The context of this verse is King David asking "who may ascend the hill, who will stand on the holy hill." The life giving power is located UP towards God, not on the ground. As we worship the living God, our eyes and head are focused on the true giver of life. In short, when we worship, we're lookin' where should be lookin'!

2. **Our Perspective** – We rely too much on our own perspective – particularly when we're in the midst of trials and tribulations. Using weather as a metaphor – we need Doplar Radar, don't we? Without it, when the storms are raging around, we don't how bad it is or how long it will last. But Doplar radar gives the extent and the size of the storm so we can be prepared.

In the same way, worship gives us a "God's Eye View" of our problems. When we spend time in His presence, He can point out the upcoming difficulties, encourage us with His word that He has our back. In short, we can receive the confidence of seeing the forest, not just the trees! Isaiah said it well...

# "...but those that wait upon the Lord, shall renew their strength. They will mount up with wings like eagles." Isaiah 40:31

I don't know about you, but I'd love to have the eagle's view of the world around us. Imagine soaring above our problems and challenges in life – seeing the entire field of view. That's what worship can provide to us – vision!

3. Our Hope – We have a hope for tomorrow because God pours out His love into us when we worship Him.

"And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit,

who has been given to us." Romans 5:5

Worship is the "in-filling" of His Holy Spirit – giving us hope when there's only despair around us. We can discover confidence, encouragement, answered prayers in the midst of our worship, and all of that projects hope for tomorrow, and hope for our life challenges. Worship is a hope giver!

Worship lifts us to a higher realm where we can see God, His plan, His hope. It like that feeling as a child when your Daddy put you up on his shoulders. Oh, how the world looks from atop your father's shoulders. So, let's lift our gaze and our hearts – there's a great big God up there!
