"Can we boast, then, that we have done anything to be accepted by God? No, because our acquittal is not based on obeying the law. It is based on faith. So, we are made right with God through faith and not obeying the law."
-Romans 3:27-28

I believe that faith is a wonderful thing. It is beautiful, in fact. When we are practicing our faith at our best, faith is that which draws our attention to the wonder of God's presence, gives us a sense of purpose, and brings communities together, even in the most difficult of moments. In moments when it comes freely, faith is a grace that inspires us to be and become who God intended us to be.

When we forget that faith is a gift, though, its powerful beauty become much less than God intended. Like the Pharisees and scribes of Jesus' time, we can turn faith into some type of legalistic thinking. Of course, like many things that we humans seek to take out of God's control and replace with our own understanding, faith then loses it vibrancy. And like the Galatians we, then, are asked, "Have you forgotten the truth that you were taught?"

Paul, in this letter to the Romans, reminds us that faith is the root of our salvation, and it is a gift that is available to all. None of us are perfect, none of us is without need of God's justifying grace; for we all come before the Throne of Glory as "blind beggars." We are all sinners, redeemed only because of the Lamb. In this season of uncertainty wherein many stones are seemingly being cast in this land of many, now divided by so many issues, I pray that you and I will be seen as the people of faith whom I believe us to be, people who would welcome the stranger who seeks to come into our house of worship. Remember, again, that we have all been saved by grace...no one, not one, is without sin and, thus, without need of God's redemption.

Romans 12:2

He does this in limitless ways – through the comfort of a friend, through a reminder through the radio of His immeasurable love for us, and in the most palpable way – He restores and moves us in worship.

When we gather as God's family, we share His love in fellowship with our friends, share encouragement with one another, and pray for those who are struggling, give thanks for His amazing goodness, sing of our praise for His glorious Son, Jesus Christ, listen to his Holy Word and listen as we hear the interpretation of those scriptures – we ought to be moved. We are moved by our memories, our gratefulness, and the presence of the Holy Spirit amongst us.

Many years ago, I suffered an unfortunate falling out with a member of my worship team. Unbeknownst to me, she was struggling with a family relationship issue and I was the unfortunate bystander hit by "drive-by anger". But her outbursts at me were hurtful, and my initial reaction would have been to go home and sulk and stew over this encounter. But the Holy Spirit guided my actions and moved me to go to the church and spend 30 minutes singing His praises in the church Sanctuary with the sound system on full blast. (If anyone had seen and heard me, they might have thought I'd lost my mind!). But in those 30 minutes, God moved me to the point where I no longer felt angry, hurt, or brokenhearted. Worship healed me and moved me to pray for this daughter of Christ that she might be healed as well.

I tell that story to encourage you to invest yourself in worship each Sunday, and each day you read God's word, and pray (for that is worship too). For in those precious moments, we can take our broken hearts, our "human-ness" before our loving God, and be moved to a new place - a better place. The force of an all powerful God can also move in the most tender ways to heal, restore, comfort, encourage, and reach the depths of our hearts.

So, worship the living God – and may the force be with you!


