California Counts

It has been a long time since anyone paid any attention to California's elections. Always late to the finish line, the general election has usually been called even while Californians are still voting. With our Primary changed to March of 2024 the focus is a little different this time. Proof being in the appearance of Ron DeSantis, Tim Scott and Donald Trump at the recent CAGOP Convention in Anaheim. Republican presidential candidates courting California voters. Apparently, this time, California counts.



Winning over the base in California could mean winning all 169 delegates at stake in our March primary — the biggest prize of any state and about 14% of the estimated total 1,234 needed to become the Republican nominee. The state party changed its rules in July to a winner-take-all system statewide, instead of dividing delegates by congressional district.

In California, Donald Trump has the loyal support of most of the party. In a Public Policy Institute of California poll this week, Trump came in at 48% among Republican likely voters — just short of the 50% plus one he needs to get all the delegates. DeSantis is the only other candidate in double digits, at 14%.

All indications are that Donald Trump will be the Republican nominee from our

party. The issue becomes can he win the general election. Polls are hugely variable on this topic. Whoever our nominee is it is critical for the future of our country, our republic, our party, and most importantly our children, that we replace the progressive socialist movement that threatens to destroy us.

We have seen what happens with our state and federal administrations. The solution may be the candidate but the real solution is in getting out the vote. We have to get people to the polls on election day. **Get the word out. Do your part and make California count.**

On July 11th members and guests enjoyed a summer evening with dinner, drinks and great friends.









I was on Maui the week the fires savagely destroyed Lahaina Town; taking with it the lives of families, too many children; and wiping away generational family homes. Only one and a half miles away, we didn't know the full extent of the destruction until we started getting bits and pieces of information from the sparse few who could get a few seconds of cell service every now and then.

All the roads from Kaanapali were closed due to downed power lines and trees. Then Lahaina Town was quickly locked down from everyone. Those of us lucky enough to not be in the fire's path wanted to help, but didn't know how. We were without power or cell service for days.

I observed people connecting with strangers in ways that they hadn't for a long time. Talking, sharing what food or supplies they had, repeatedly saying "we are in this together." I recognized this to be our humanity – the way we are supposed to interact with our fellow humans.

There was a vibe to it. Everyone gravitated to it. When the road opened in one direction toward the airport, people wanted to stay, still not knowing when there would be electricity and cell service again. Unfortunately, in our ideologically and politically divided society – it's our sense of community that is often missing. In the face of tragedy people became a community again.


Just like we did after the 9/11 attacks. Just like we did after the Northridge earthquake. Just like we did after the Woolsey fires.




