For this, I bring together some of Toronto's most exciting contemporary artists, with our marvellous Master of Ceremonies, **Nicole Inica Hamilton**, weaving together the evening's performances.

- This immersive performance and film Cabaret begins with Shannon Litzenberger's World After Dark.
- Next, Naishi Wang shares his stunning solo, *Taking Breath*.
- As the night advances, JAYU presents their work in the space where art and human rights connect, with *Afro Anthology*, co-created by Lex & Martin Gomes.
- Next, tap dance griot, **Travis Knights**, will be engaging in a *'Tap'athetical Meditation* of sound and movement.
- In the final live performance of the evening, Jaz 'Fairy J' Simone invites you to attend *The Reception:* A gathering; a performance; an experience.

Our intrepid MC, Nicole, will then invite you to stay with us for a screening of some of JAYU's celebrated, experimental human rights films, along with Toronto Dance Theatre's *Bin Chicken* film by Alyssa Martin.

#### TAKING BREATH by Naishi Wang October 1 at 8:30 PM

Breathing - an innate action of taking in air and expelling it from the lungs. *Taking Breath* brings the subconscious to the conscious, the passive to the active; questioning how we have taken breathing and the air we breathe, for granted. The piece is a choreographic inquiry exploring the multiple facets of breathing in our lives - What is it like without breathing? What is it like with too much breathing? Note from Alyssa Martin:

"Let me give you a quick run down of the namesake of this work. It's a brilliant, almost demonic looking bird with a long black snout and feathery white body about the size of a terrier. It trots around town feasting on people's trash (hence their nickname, the Bin Chicken, after the garbage bins they love). When I first saw one in the flesh, I was surprised to find I related to its awkward, disjointed demeanor, and admired its unapologetic presence. I quickly grew to love them, and their ability to make a plentiful meal out of what the rest of us have disposed of and wish to forget. I kept two tender reminders with me throughout this process; a DVD copy of the staged version of "CATS: The Musical" and a journal entry I wrote in a coffee shop in Byron Bay, Australia where I describe myself as "fun trash" about fifteen different times in an attempt to reckon with a wounded heart.

And now, through pandemic, injury, laughter, mishaps and the incredible ingenuity and hard work of the amazing team at TDT, this piece attempts to make a proverbial palace of our collective trash. The world which these artists conjured became a place of much-needed questioning, wildness, and escape. It was a place to juggle nonsensical advice, to question Beethoven, to deal with transition, to move forward and dig deeper, finding clues to our own lives buried within this lopsided reality, and from these clues a new kind of resilience.

It was such an honour to be invited to create this work for Toronto Dance Theatre in 2019. I can say I found immense joy in this world, and am so grateful to have navigated it alongside such incredible people. I'm overjoyed to be sharing *Bin Chicken* with you. I hope that by the end of this, you find something you were looking for too!"
