



Putting the Parent in Charge of their Child's Education

Education Savings Account (ESA)

Parents may establish a state-controlled Education Savings Account ("ESA") for each TK-12 child in California.

Funded \$17,000 Each Year Using Prop 98 Money
 Annually, the account receives the student's share of Prop 98 funds, starting around \$17,000 in the first year and increasing yearly with California's economy. No tax increase.

Choose an Accredited School

(Public, Charter, Private, Parochial, or Homeschool)
 Parents enroll their child in a participating accredited school and direct the state to distribute ESA funds to cover tuition and educational expenses. Parents don't touch the money; the transaction occurs between the state-controlled ESA and the chosen accredited school.

Unspent ESA Funds Carry-Over and Earn Interest

Unused funds in the ESA carry over, earning interest for future education expenses.

- ESA Funds can be used During the Student's Lifetime
 Unused funds after 12th grade can be applied to education throughout the child's life, including trade schools, colleges, and postgraduate studies.

 Unused ESA funds may be transferred or gifted to another student's eligible ESA or a participating accredited school.

Legislative Report By Gina Libby

As of April 25, 2025, President Trump has signed 214 Executive Actions in his first 90 days in office. There were only 220 signed in his first term. <u>https://www.whitehouse.gov/presidentialactions/</u>

DOGE continues to reveal fraud and abuse: https://doge.gov/savings. In other news, the trans activism erupting in city halls across the nation appears organized and well-funded by the national Indivisibles organization. Ventura County Indivisibles has been very active engaging school boards to adopt transgender affirming care.

Our own City of Ventura is attempting to adopt the C.A.R.E. policy and make it a sanctuary city for transgender healthcare, abortion, and immigration protection. At their March 18th City Council meeting, over 140 public speakers shared their views. While the trans activists were given much leeway with their cursing and verbal outbursts, the mayor cut off a Christian woman mid-prayer during her public comments, stating, "we don't pray here". Since then, a Constitutional Attorney has taken her case, and the city has been served with a lawsuit. The matter will be heard again in June. Godspeak representatives will be there, and attendance is encouraged.

Gavin Newsom released a plan to impose a mileage tax on all California drivers! As reported by Rebuild California, this week, CA Democrats are taking up 5 additional tax hikes in the state legislature. Keep track of the upcoming 9 Property Tax Bills, Payroll Tax, Vacancy Tax (SB 789), Social Media Tax (AB 796), Mileage Tax (AB 1421) and Income Tax (AB 1428).
