Legislative Report (cont.)

- I. For information and Action Steps on bills affecting children, parent's rights, and schools, go to: https://www.perkadvocacy.com/california-legislation
 - a. The horrendous bill AB 1955 in a "gut and amend" trick by the legislature was signed into law by the Governor. This bill prohibits schools from adopting notification policies to parents when their children request to use a pronoun or the bathrooms/locker rooms of the opposite sex. The bill will be contested, and PERK will help lead the charge.
 - Still on the Governor's desk is AB 2442—which expedites licensing for doctors and healthcare providers if they provide gender-affirming care.
 Call to oppose.
 - II. For Ventura County, tune into the Board of Supervisors meetings generally held two to three times per month on Tuesdays. You'll be shocked how many millions pass through the Board every session.


