

UPDATE: A DANGEROUS NEW BILL INTRODUCED IN SACRAMENTO!

AB1333

A new bill would significantly restrict self-defense rights in California, including the rights of people protecting their homes.

The bill's sponsor, Assemblymember Rick Chavez Zbur (D–Los Angeles), promised to amend the proposal to not take away self-defense rights after Republicans came out against it in force.

The big picture: <u>Assembly Bill 1333</u> would eliminate certain circumstances under which homicide is justifiable, including in defense of a home or property.

- Current state law says homicide is justifiable "when committed in defense of habitation, property, or person" against someone who intends to commit a felony or intends to enter a home with violence.
- Zbur's bill would delete that protection.
- It would also add a series of circumstances in which homicide is not justifiable, including when a person was outside of their home and knew that using force likely to cause death or great bodily injury could have been avoided with complete safety by retreating. It would also state that homicide is not justifiable when a person uses more force than reasonably necessary to defend against a danger.
