Legislative Report

As of Aug. 29, 2025, President Trump has signed 359 Executive Actions; there were only 220 signed in his first term. <https://www.whitehouse.gov/presidential-actions/>

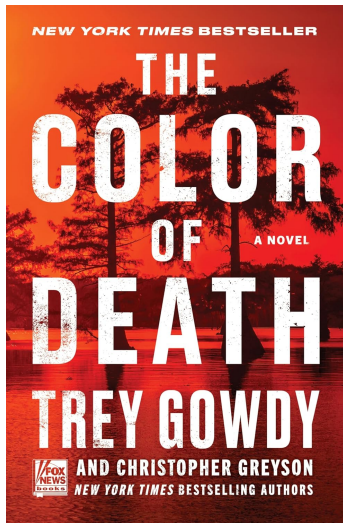
Election Integrity: President Trump has been highlighting the deficiencies with electronic voting systems and mail-in ballots. Stay tuned with local action on the election integrity front by following Restore the Vote Ventura at <https://restorethevoteventura.org>. They continue to pressure the Board of Supervisors and VC Registrar of Voters Michelle Ascencion with questions about their preparedness for the midterm's elections given President Trump's Executive Orders and other recent statements / tweets.

Funding Illegal Immigration: Organized leftist organizations are on the move locally in Ventura County. Due to the efforts of Indivisible, the City of Ventura adopted the C.A.R.E. policy in June which made the city a sanctuary for unfettered abortion, gender-affirming care for minors, and illegal immigration.

Similar to Indivisible working behind the scenes with City of Ventura council members, several illegal immigrant nonprofits and NGO's worked behind the scenes with Supervisor Vianey Lopez on her proposal for the Board of Supervisors to spend over \$6 million dollars funding the undocumented, to allocate 7 new positions in the Public Defender's to provide for their legal representation, and to the VC Office of Education to provide "know your rights" training to migrant families. The public comments lasted over 8 hours and were split between the August 12 and 26, 2025, board meetings. ventura.org/bosmeetings.

The nonprofits including 805UndocuFund, 805 Immigrants, VC Defensa, and the Party for Liberation and Socialism, mounted a Rapid Response Network, to alert their activists of ICE activity locations so they can show up to oppose ICE efforts and dox agents. These groups continue to bombard our city councils demanding money and support services for the undocumented. The Ventura County Community Foundation (VCCF) also came before the Board requesting funds to support families affected by recent ICE activity. Supervisors Parvin and Gorell voted against funding the immigrant nonprofits citing fiscal responsibility, so the request failed.

The City of Thousand Oaks committed \$100,000 to the Neighborhood Fund, supported by the VCCF, on their consent agenda with no discussion. The City of Camarillo council members put forth a request for \$75,000 on their agenda, but it was continued until the next meeting. It's imperative that we show up at these meetings to provide counter arguments for using taxpayer money to defend illegal immigration activity.

Voter Identification

Laws regarding voter identification for voting did not exist until 2006. However, voter registration laws were implemented as early as 1870 to begin identifying voters. It was considered necessary as the population was growing and older methods were not practical.

In 2006 Indiana was the first state to implement voter identification as a requirement for voting. While it was challenged during the case of *Crawford v. Marion County Election Board*, the Supreme Court majority concluded that there was a legitimate intent to prevent voter fraud and that the burden imposed on voters was minimal.

It is interesting that while we are all required to have a real ID to travel, the democratic party finds that it is too burdensome for everyone to have an ID. That is interesting, because if our system was working well, all legal citizens would have access to ID, it should not be too difficult for a legal citizen to obtain.

There are campaigns in many states seeking to add voter identified to the ballot for upcoming elections. The current initiative in California is led by Carl DeMaio and more information can be found at www.VoterIDVolunteer.org

If passed, Prop 50 will **repeal part of the 2010 Voters First Act for Congress**, which gave the power to draw California's Congressional districts to an independent 14-member Citizens Redistricting Commission.

Voting NO would keep the current system and independent citizens in charge. Voting YES puts the State Legislature in charge of those maps.

Prop 50 will **cost taxpayers nearly \$300 million to hold a special election** while California is facing a \$20 billion deficit.

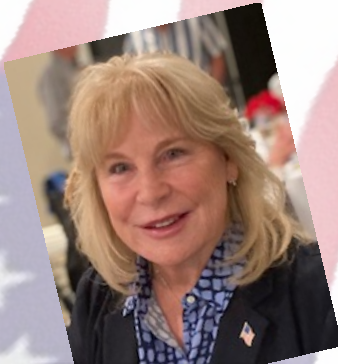

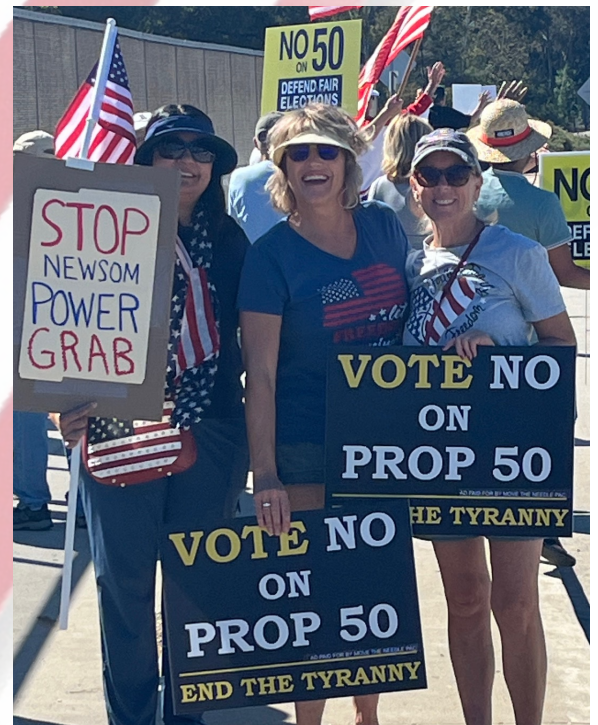

1993–2025

Charlie Kirk, the founder of Turning Point USA and a major impetus behind the youth turnout for Donald Trump in November, was shot to death at Utah Valley University.

Ironically, he was talking about the recent spate of transgender shooters and mass killings when a single shot, fired at close range hit him in the neck. He was pronounced dead at Timpanogos Hospital a short time later.

- 1) Pay attention to and participate in local politics.
- 2) Join campaign early—this gives you leverage, strategy & momentum. Ask candidates you support what they need. There are 135 positions coming up on ballot in 2026. Put people in before filing deadlines. It takes a team for a candidate to win!
- 3) Middle voter is most important—100% of campaign money should be spent on winning them. You have until Friday at 6 pm to pull paperwork to run for office and another 4 days if no one files!

Expose and fight corruption which preys on voter apathy. Go door knocking and use social media to reach voters. 80% of the voters are uninformed!
