

He was a past Board member of HPOA. Back in the Good Old Days.


He loved his Golf and being an owner back in those days. He always said that's why he came down from New Jersey. Thanks again.

#### **OUR "WAVERS"**

From time to time questions arise about the need for the gatehouse people, even I myself have questioned their existence until being elected to your board. Now being in charge of our "wavers", it has enlightened me of how important they are to our community.

#### Example:

- 1) They are the eyes and ears for us, reporting what they see and hear in their logs.
- 2) They are the "command center" for our deputies, to whom they dispatch, with complaints reported to our office.
- 3) They field calls to the gate house from concerned residents about problems, and try to direct the caller to a solution, either to an agency or directing our deputy to the situation. Our deputies work 365 days a year, the hours are confidential for obvious reasons.
- 4) They field questions from passing motorists regarding almost anything.
- 5) if they observe a situation needing assistance, they will call the sheriff's department.
- 6) They try to personally greet incoming cars with a wave, to make you feel welcome.
- 7) if the deputy finds a problem within our community, needing a contact, the Gate House People have the information available.

Our "wavers" work for minimum wage, they occupy the Gate House by themselves too late into the night.

Please give them some consideration, maybe a wave back, to acknowledge them and please slow down. If prospective buyers are looking in The Heather, seeing a friendly "Waver" and Gate House to greet them, in my opinion, their existence enhances the property values for all who live here.



#### Meeting came to order at 7:00 PM.

**Board members present:** Joe Cuccio, President, Tom Taylor, Vice President/Treasurer; Richard Rivers, Director of Security and Corporate Secretary

Richard asked the Board for a motion to approve the minutes of the January 18, 2021 board meeting; Joe accepted the motion and Tom 2<sup>rd</sup> the motion; vote 3-0 in favor.

#### President/Administration Report: Joe Cuccio

- Joe gave tribute to his friend and Board member, James Perretto who passed from COVID-19. He will be greatly missed by all as he headed the Events and took great care of our buildings.



#### St. Patrick's Day Fun Facts

#### The Parades

While Ireland didn't stage their first parade until 1931, Boston and New York were in dispute as to who really started the first St. Patrick's Day parade. Boston claims they held their first one in 1737 while New York had their first in 1762.

#### From Blue to Green

Blue was the original color of St. Patrick's Day as it is the dominant color of the ancient Irish flag. However, after the Irish Rebellion in 1798, the Irish soldiers differentiated themselves from the British (who are wearing red clothing) by wearing full green uniforms. The shamrock on their hats was a symbol of rebellion.

#### **Shamrock**

Shamrock is the symbol of Ireland. It was associated with St. Patrick as legends claim that he used shamrock to teach people about the Holy Trinity.

#### **Corned Beef and Cabbage**

Corned Beef and cabbage is the traditional meal of St. Patrick's Day. However, to save money, some celebrate with Irish bacon in New York.

#### The Leprechaun

Leprechauns are ingrained in Irish folklore, but traditionally they were much different than what we know of them as today. The modern-day leprechaun is in fact American, introduced by Disney in the film "Darby O'Gill & the Little People."
