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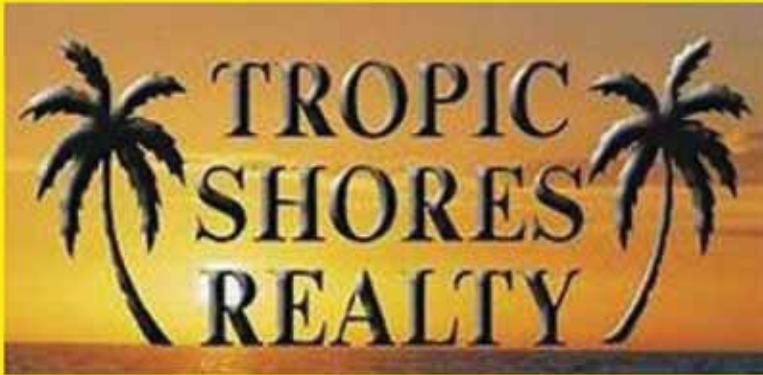

Hello to the Heather Community, hoping everyone had a great Easter with family and friends and that the kids enjoyed the Easter egg hunt along with the Easter bunny!

What did you think about the Board getting the dumpsters for the community to use for four days for cleanup, so you didn't need to make a dump run? Three bids were secured, and the best bid was chosen which included 2 dumpsters with numerous fill-ups and removals. If everyone is happy with this type of service, in the future, we can look at doing it again. This idea was brought to the Board by Issac Thompson.

There seems to be a little confusion as we are voting on proposed revisions to the current deed restrictions for fences, utility trailers and the 51 percent voting rule.

- Regarding fences - the newly drafted deed restrictions under Article VI, Section 5 will be more specific to include the policies on fences, not just information about living fences.
- With the utility trailers, as was done with the fences, a sub-committee will work with the A&D committee to draw up effective policies.
- The proposed revision to the current deed restrictions includes changing the wording from 51 percent of the total Heather membership to 51 percent of the votes returned for a given deed restriction change. If this passes, it would affect all future proposed deed restriction revisions for the community.

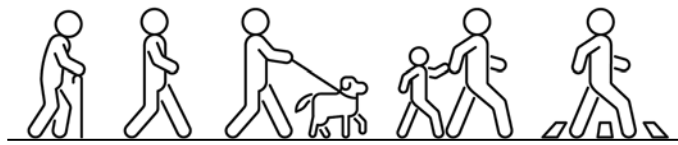
Please take the time to fill out your ballots and return them. These are the things that the community has asked for, so we're trying to provide that so more families would enjoy living in our Heather community.

Safety Reminders from WREC

- Never trim, prune, or remove trees near power lines.
- Only use qualified licensed tree contractors to remove or trim trees growing near power lines.
- If you plan to remove or trim a tree near WREC power lines, please contact your local Cooperative office at 352-596-4000.
- It is recommended that trees and shrubs are not planted within 50 feet of WREC overhead power lines, especially trees that grow greater than 25 feet in height.

If you are going to plant shrubs, trees, or install a fence, be sure to call 811 forty-eight hours before you dig so power lines, and other possible hazards can be located.

Please be aware of the new signs for children playing in areas where the kids sometimes play in the streets.

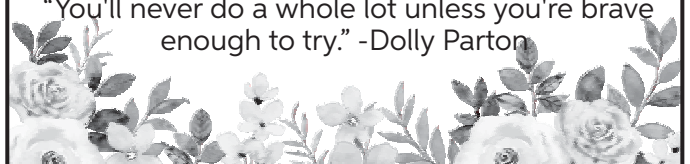

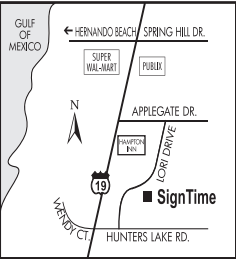

This is to address the controversy over the abrupt removal of the Peacocks and Peahens from the community.

Peafowl removal was necessary as their overpopulation and nuisance behavior far outweighed the beauty their presence had bestowed upon our community.

Please also note that in Hernando County, Florida, there are no specific ordinances prohibiting or regulating the removal of Peafowl. Property owners can generally remove Peafowl from their property, either themselves or by hiring a third party. However, they must ensure the removal is done humanely and does not cause physical injury to the birds.



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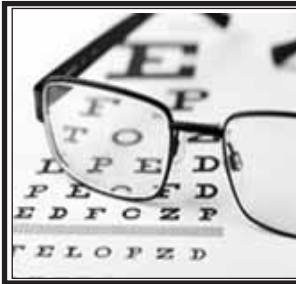

The Fairway

Hello, all fellow owners.

This is the last piece of information you will be receiving from me before the May 6 meeting.

I know you are getting a lot of information which goes against everything that I share with you and you must be over your head with it all and wondering what is going on and who you should trust that is working in your best interest and listening to you.

Rather than respond to what is happening with the other two board members I will outline what I represent and what those who support me are working to make happen. It is important for me to insert at this time that the other two Board members voted against all of the following items. I advised them that it was my fiduciary responsibility to inform all owners of their decisions. This is when it all started, and they and the management company have done every last thing they can to stop us.

- Change the meeting time from 3:30 to 7:00.
- Change the number of Board members to five.
- Increase the number of owners participating in the Budget Committee.
- Get totally computerized to receive monthly reports so everyone will have access information they want or need.
- Get a website that will not cost \$3300+ and a monthly service fee.
- Have a Board that listens to Fairway owners and does their best to implement what you need or want.

The current Board does not want to entertain any changes for a new property management company, even though a new property management company can provide the required statutory requirements for the same money we currently are paying.

I (and others) have put many, many work hours into this huge change that is necessary for The Fairway to be brought up to date and make it the place you want it to be living in and enjoying. The information I have

given you was not picked out of a hat, and I have all the paperwork and documentation for you to look at should you request it.

Bottom line – if you want things to remain just as they are then vote in a different direction and/or listen to their rhetoric. Again, they have voted against every item I have listed above. This is a fact, and I cannot imagine how they could deny this.

It is imperative for all our Fairway owners to attend this important meeting!

I know this is a huge endeavor and change is not easy but we either move forward or live with things as they are.

Thank you to those of you who attended the Annual Meeting last month. A special thank you to owners, Charlie & Deanna Smith for working the ground game of going door to door to remind people about meeting and getting proxies turned in. Per our documents we achieved a quorum at a duly-noticed meeting and our two proxy votes passed. In other news, welcome to our newest board member Gregroy Rudminsky. Thank you for volunteering your time to The Greens!

Speaking of meetings; at the time of writing this, there is an upcoming HPOA meeting scheduled for May 19, 2025, to vote on amendments to The Heather Property Owners' Deed Restrictions. Between now and the time of reading this, hopefully there has been clarification on the process of this vote adhering to our governing documents of The Heather Property Owners Association as well as FL statute.

Per our governing documents Declarations Of Restrictions, Article VII General Provisions, Section 2, 2nd paragraph first sentence reads –

Written notice of any proposed amendments to these Declaration of Restrictions shall be sent to every Owner at least forty-five days in advance of any action taken.

Per 2024 FL Statute 720.306 Meetings of members; voting and election procedures; amendments. Section (1) QUORUM; AMENDMENTS, (d), 6, (e) reads –

A proposal to amend the governing documents must contain the full text of the provision to be amended

and may not be revised or amended by reference solely to the title or number. Proposed new language must be underlined, and proposed deleted language must be stricken. If the proposed change is so extensive that underlining and striking through language would hinder, rather than assist, the understanding of the proposed amendment, a notation must be inserted immediately preceding the proposed amendment in substantially the following form: "Substantial rewording. See governing documents for current text." An amendment to a governing document is effective when recorded in the public records of the county in which the community is located.

I'm not an HOA attorney, but as of this writing from what I've learned, I don't believe the above has been followed.

I'm not being negative on the original proposed amendments that a homeowner put a lot of time into. However, the changing of the wording regarding 51% returned votes is a different story. As a community we have to follow our governing documents & state statutes. On important issues like this, when we don't, it becomes a waste of time and the owners' money. Not to mention the HPOA could be vulnerable to possible litigation in the future.

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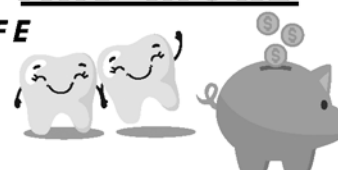

Be ready for an emergency or disaster:

Create an Emergency Kit: Your emergency kit should have supplies specific to your needs.

Write It Down: Keep a copy of important phone numbers and other contact information for loved ones, medical providers, and services as part of your emergency kit.

Complete a Personal Assessment: Make a list of personal needs and your resources needed during a disaster and include it in your kit.

Have a Support Network: Identify people to involve in planning who can help in an emergency situation. They may include nearby family, friends, caregivers, neighbors, and co-workers.

Get Informed: Know the specific hazards that threaten your community (hurricanes, tornadoes, wildfires, etc.), and learn more about any assistance programs. Visit **FloridaDisaster.org** to learn if you are in an evacuation zone.
