Architectural and Design Committee

In the last weeks complaints have heen on the rise about VEHICLES IMPROPERLY PARKED.

Please — it's in your best interest to adhere to the rules about vehicles! The committee and board do not want to assess fines for violations!

Here are the rules/regs for all to follow:

No vehicles of any kind may be placed on the homeowner's property. This includes the front, rear and side areas of the property. Exception: One boat may be parked at the side of the house or rear yard.

Private vehicles (cars, vans and light trucks) must be parked on the driveway of the home.

No commercial vehicles may be parked overnight at the resident's home.

No RV's, campers, or trailers of any kind may be parked at the resident's home, unless parked for loading and unloading or minor repairs (see Article VI, Section 8M) must be completed in three (3) days.

No vehicles of any kind shall be parked overnight in the area of the Heather designated as common areas.

All private vehicles must have a current registration and be in operating condition.

The following are violations of Heather Walk rules and regulations or governing documents Remove potted plants, or plant them in the ground
Remove potted plants, or plant them in the ground
Remove all empty pots and containers that might collect water and breed mosquitoes
Remove all statues, gnomes, flags, etc from planting areas
Back yard 36 inch area needs weeding and/or raking
Back yard 36 inch area trim or remove overgrown bushes
Remove furniture from back yard area overnight
No bird houses, bird feeders, or bird baths allowed
Hanging pots are only allowed UNDER your front porch
You are only allowed 3 items of appropriate size on the front window sill
Edging must be at ground level unless necessary for flood control
No garbage cans should be outside except on pick up days
Remove items that may become projectiles in strong winds
Grills must be stored on a concrete slab or pavers, and used at least 15 feet from the building
Cannot have decorations attached to the outside of the building
One flag is allowed, and is to be attached to the brick fascia on either side of the garage
Use wall hanger/hose caddy to keep the hose off the ground/out of the way of the landscape workers

Provisional Minutes until approved on September 20, 2021

Tom Taylor called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. - PLEDGE

Board members present: Tom Taylor, President/Treasurer, , Gerri Lampton – Vice President/Events and Building, Joe Cuccio 3rd VP/Security and Gatehouse, Rich Mayer Director at Large/RV Compound, Bill Fasulo, 2nd Vice President/Grounds/Lochs excused from the meeting. 11 members also present.

Gerri asked the Board to approve the minutes from July 19, 2021 meeting, Rich Mayer made the motion and Joe Cuccio. 2rd the motion. Vote 4-0 in favor.

Gerri brought many thanks for the cards and well wishes from The Heather community plus the understanding for the amount of time she has missed and Ruthie has missed due to the illnesses and loss of their husbands. James David Lampton (Gerri's husband) passed on July 3rd, and a memorial service was held at Spring Hill Baptist Church on August 19th, 2021. Wayne J. Grim, SR. passed on July 26th. His Celebration of Life will be held (Ruthie's husband) here in the Club House on October 16th at 2pm. Again thanks for your patience with us throughout this grieving process.

President/Administration Report:

Joe Cuccio reported on the wild pigs hanging around and damaging properties at the Fairways at buildings 11 & 12, Heather Walk and the Gatehouse. One pig has been captured, a female dalmatian. The trap has been removed since the male pig has not been seen in the area. The Fairways split the cost with the HPOA and this can now be put to rest.

Treasurer Report

WREC is lowering our bills \$2 while others are raising their prices. Pretty thankful for that!

Masks are recommended at the office and gatherings.

Health Department offers testing at the Fairgrounds and vaccinations.

Publix also offers vaccinations free.

There are 100 shots available but only 30-32 are taking advantage per day.

Administration reports the hospitals have Ambulances waiting at the ER's you may wait 1 hour to have them respond to get you to the hospital. There are 25 waiting for a ventilator but only 17 are available.

Volume versus space, the doctor's are reporting they have the space but not enough staff to serve the patients.

Profit & Loss and the balance sheet are in line.

Late List – Tom pointed out the top account that was on the Late List will be written off due to it being a sink hole property and we will not be able to collect. This will bring the list down to a smaller amount. Late letters will keep going out to collect all debt.

Insurance - we were going to shop around but with the absence of Gerri and Ruthie we will go with the company we have now. We anticipate an increase on this.

A&D Committee

These properties will be going to the Fine Committee:

Property in violation with the purple blob painted on the side of the house facing the neighbor's residence as they receive a certified letter warning them of the charges daily of \$100. Max of \$1,000. Tom made the motion and Rich 2rd the motion. 4-0 in favor. This may end in a court case.

A tree stand has been in violation and will also be charged \$100 per day with the Max of \$1,000 and will receive a certified letter. Joe made the motion and Rich 2nd the motion with 4-0 in favor.

An above ground pool is in violation and will be sent a certified letter as they will be charged \$100 per day with the Max of \$1,000. Joe made the motion and Rich 2rd the motion with 4-0 in favor.

RV Compound

Rich Mayer – 2 spaces available, 4 on the waiting list. We received a partial payment from a resident to secure the boat and will be collecting the rest shortly. There will be stenciled numbers refreshed for each lot. 3 Seasons will be contacted to mow the lot.

Grounds and Lakes

Bill Fasulo called Dept of Public Works and fixed the Burm on Edinburgh with a mound of dirt and gravel. Ponds are looking full and good.

Building & Events:

Gerri is keeping all supplies stocked and full.

There is Karaoke on the 2nd Friday of every month. For the 1st event Tony Price brought the Karaoke CD's and equipment along with Ruthie bringing in her keyboard. 15 people were at the clubhouse and we all had a good time dancing, singing and fellowshipping together.
