President's Corner

August is here and so is our long awaited Traffic Light . After 10 long years of letter writing and contacting Local and State Officials it finally has been installed. I know many people have questioned whether or not it would ever happen but here it is. Please remember you still need to be cautious at this intersection since most of the fatalities and accidents were Driver error. The light will serve as a warning to oncoming traffic that the intersection is controlled by a traffic light but that doesn't mean you should count on everyone stopping. People making a turn on Red could pull out in front of you as they have done with the Stop signs. Continue to exercise caution at this intersection.

The Heat seems to be unrelenting with higher than normal temps for this time of year. Make sure you keep hydrated and limit your outdoor activities to early morning early evening to minimize heat stroke. Drinking plenty of water is essential if you are outside doing whatever.

I want to remind everyone that we are in Hurricane Season and being prepared is the best way to deal with any storms that come our way. September is usually the peak month for storms in our area. Water, Batteries, Canned foods, etc., are necessary when a storm is Forecast. Keep the car filled with fuel don't wait to fill up when the Gas stations are out of fuel.

Check your generator, if you have one, to make sure it is in running condition and you have an ample supply of fuel.

The Pandemic is still ongoing and while we have reopened the Community Center for Bingo and a few other events please exercise caution and keep Social Distancing guidelines. We have a supply of hand sanitizer at the entrance doors for your use. The tables are sanitized every Tuesday morning by the cleaning crew. Wipes are available for the tables should you feel the need to use them. Hernando County is among the Counties with the lower reported cases and fatalities. That doesn't mean you should not exercise caution when coming in contact with any group of people.

The Office is open to assist you with any concerns you may have and we ask that you stay behind the half door when conducting your business. Board meetings continue to be held on the 3rd Monday of the month as usual. Seating is spaced to comply with social distancing guidelines and hand sanitizer is available for your use.

In closing I want to thank everyone who supports the Board in this trying time and please know your Board continues to function on a Daily basis for the good of the Community







H. P. O. A. Board of Director's Meeting July 20, 2020

Provisional Minutes until approved on August 17, 2020

Meeting came to order at 7:00 PM.

Board members present: Joe Cuccio, President; Tom Taylor, Vice President/Treasurer, Barbara Dohm 2nd Vice President; Richard Rivers Corporate Secretary, Security and Gatehouse, James Perretto, 3rd Vice President/Events. Eight members also present.

Richard asked the Board for a motion to approve the minutes from June 15th, 2020, Joe made the motion and Jimmy 2nd the motion; vote 5-0 in favor.

President/Administration Report:

Joe mentioned the traffic light is being constructed after many letters and requests..

Now the question is how long will it take to have it completed?, The goal is 2 weeks. We are hoping it doesn't take long. Sadly 14 lives were lost due to no traffic light.

Joe is sending a letter stating no turn on red. Residents should not cut in since traffic is no doubt going at 70 to 75 mph. It took so long to get this accomplished due to driver's errors per Sheriff's Department. This is costing the state over half a million dollars. We are thankful to have this light going in to save lives. Please respect it!

Due to the surge in the Pandemic, masks are mandatory at the restaurant, 'Slice of Life Two" as of course you can remove it to eat and then place it back on as you leave.

We provide hand sanitizers at the door for all meetings and games. Our cleaning company comes in each Tuesday morning to sanitize the tables with Clorox sheets and bleach for our bathroom facilities.

The picnic tables were completed and put together by three Board members, Joe Cuccio, Jimmy Perretto and Richard Rivers and one member Tony Torregrossa. They have also been coated and the wood is treated as well. They are placed in strategic areas for your enjoyment in the park right next to the Clubhouse. Please use them at your leisure.

No one is allowed to come past the half door at the office due to your protection and Ruthie's. We sanitize the door knobs and half door so everyone is protected.

The fiscal year is May to May and the dues have stayed the same. \$22 due the 1st of each month.

Treasurer's Report

- The financials are looking good. There are 14 in collections as we are working with our attorney and we have been very successful in collecting bad debt. It's so much better to keep the dues up to par rather then pay a much greater amount to the attorney.
- The late list is at the amount of \$7,351.17. Letters will go out to collect these delinquent dues.

Security:

- The Gatehouse has new keys since someone unauthorized with a key entered and trashed the place. Georgia Moore, one of our
 employees, cleaned it up. Cigarette holders are being emptied by the Gatehouse also. Cameras are there to find the person(s) doing this.
- Signs are placed around lake and ponds enforcing the restrictions.
- Traffic requirements are not being followed as we have deputies watching for those going over the speed limits.

RV Compound:

- The RV Compound is full. If there are any openings, Ruthie has a list of those interested in renting a space as it becomes available.
- There have been repairs to the fence at \$750 and eleven lights at \$10 each placed for protection.
- A deputy watches over the compound 365 days in the year.
- Storage cost is \$75 per year, Richard Rivers makes a motion to increase this to \$100 per year and Jimmy Perretto 2nd the motion.
- Our fiscal year begins in May 2021 the cost will be \$100 at that time.

Grounds:

Rails have been painted with reflective paint on Heather Blvd. and new signs also reflective are placed in strategic areas to protect the lakes, ponds and areas of The Heather.

Sprinklers were not turned on so we lost bushes at the front entrance. They will be replaced at the Gatehouse.

Building:

- Building is running fine.
- Water faucet outside the Clubhouse capped off and removed due to a leaking pipe under the ground.

Events/Activities:

- The fall Community Yard Sale will be held on Saturday, November 7th, 2020, 8am to 5pm.
- Veterans Day flyers will be available this month to plan a BBQ, \$10 with a sign up sheet.
- Name That Tune will be held on Friday, November 14 with prizes and a lot of fun. BYOB See the flyer.
- Christmas party will be held Dec. 5th with more information on the flyer available at the Clubhouse office.

New/Old Business:

None

Meeting was adjourned by Joe Cuccio at 8:00 pm. Next meeting will be on Monday, August 17th, 2020 at 7P.M. at the Clubhouse.




