

8 – 10 t-shirts (100% cotton preferable) your own or thrift store bought. One should fit fairly well for the top of the dress. The rest we buy for the fabric, so size doesn't matter - the larger the better. Try to get a good weight fabric, not too flimsy, long sleeved ones too.

Cutting matt and cutter Ruler, Tape measure Serger or sewing machine Thread & Pins, Big needle with large eye

Preparation:

Wash all t-shirts

Pick one to be the 'top' of the dress. This should fit you well in the shoulders. We can alter the neckline later to be more 'feminine'. Sleeve length is up to you.

Next, cut the rest of the shirts – open sides, take off sleeves and cut shoulders to remove front from back - basically cutting all seams open.

The following are violations of Heather Walk rules and regulations or governing documents:

Barrey poting plants or plant them in the around
Remove potted plants, or plant them in the ground
Remove all empty pots and containers that might collect water and breed mosquitoes
Remove all statues, gnomes, flags, etc from planting areas
Back yard 36 inch area needs weeding and/or raking
Back yard 36 inch area trim or remove overgrown bushes
Remove furniture from back yard area overnight
No bird houses, bird feeders, or bird baths allowed
Hanging pots are only allowed UNDER your front porch
You are only allowed 3 items of appropriate size on the front window sill
Edging must be at ground level unless necessary for flood control
No garbage cans should be outside except on pick up days
Remove items that may become projectiles in strong winds
Grills must be stored on a concrete slab or pavers, and used at least 15 feet from the building
Cannot have decorations attached to the outside of the building
One flag is allowed, and is to be attached to the brick fascia on either side of the garage

Board members present: Tom Taylor, President/Treasurer, Bill Fasulo, 2nd Vice President/Grounds/Lochs, Joe Cuccio 3nd VP/Security and Gatehouse, Rich Mayer Director at Large/RV Compound, Gerri Lampton – Vice President/Events and Building excused from the meeting. 10 members also present.

Tom asked the Board to approve the minutes from June 21, 2021 meeting, Joe Cuccio made the motion and Rich Mayer. 2nd the motion. Vote 4-0 in favor.

President/Administration Report:

Tom spoke of problems being solved handled by the board needs to be given to the correct board member and communication is key to getting things solved.

Joe Cuccio reported on the wild pigs hanging around and damaging properties at the Fairways at buildings 11 & 12, Heather Walk and the Gatehouse. One pig has been captured, a female dalmation. The trap is set for the 2nd one to be captured we hope very soon. Heather Walk's damages has been repaired.

Treasurer Report

A&D Committee

Approved recommendation of the fine committee to charge \$100 per day not exceeding \$1,000 of the property with 2 boats and 1 trailer. The Board put the fine on hold due to compliance to the letter received.

Motion to send property with paint blob on side of house to finance committee. Motion by Joe Cuccio and 2rd Bill Fasulo.4-0 approved.

RULES AND REGULATIONS 2021

- 1. All improvements/alterations such as gutters, downspouts, storm doors, windows, garage doors, porch enclosures etc. must have Board of Directors approval prior to work commencing.
- 2. No temporary or permanent utility or storage shed, building, tent, structure or improvement to include: bird and animal feeding stations, the hanging of potted plants and personal items from trees in Common Areas or from elements of dwelling premises extending over Commons Area shall be constructed or maintained without prior approval of the Board of Directors. Potted plants must be under roof of front entrance or on the front window shelf.
- 3. Farm animals, poultry, birds, squirrels, reptiles, and ducks will not be raised, maintained, or fed. No more than 2 animals of reasonable size are allowed per unit if their presence causes no disturbance to others.
 - All pets must be leashed and under control at all times.
 - Persons walking pets in Heather Walk must carry container to pick up dropping from their pets. These droppings must be returned to owner's premises for disposal.
- 4. Swimming, climbing on rocks or entry into lakes adjacent to or within the properties is prohibited. Owners must inform renters, guests and invitees of these prohibitions.
- 5. No trailers, boats, boat trailers, travel trailers, unlicensed motorcycles, motor homes, buses, commercial vehicles, or commercial equipment shall be parked overnight on the properties except within an enclosed garage. No vehicles of any natureiincluding golf carts and bicyclesishall begarked on anlportion of the propertiesilots or Common Areas at any-time except within an enclosed garage, or on the surfaced parking area adjacent to each lot, or on the street.

NO PARKING ON THE GRASS!

- You will be billed for damage to sod andlor sprinkler system if found parking on grass
- Parking prohibited in driveways other than assigned driveway. Written approval must be obtained from owner. A copy is to be filed at office.
- Vehicles without current registration will be towed at owner's expense
- No street parking shall be allowed 12 A.M. 7.00 A.M.
- 6. Outdoor clothes drying is not allowed. inside clothes drying must be screened from street view and neighbors.
- 7. Signs (name plates excluded) will not be attached or displayed on any part of building or

common area. "For Sale" or "For Rent" signs (18"x 30" or smaller no higher than 3' above ground) will be restricted to front of planting area behind walkway facing street, or in front villa window.' Name plates must have Board approval prior to installation

- 8. Trade or commercial use of any residential lot is prohibited.
- 9. Lots will be maintained in a clean and sanitary manner. Rubbish (including old tires, garbage, etc.) must not accumulate. Fire hazards prohibited. Residents are responsible for keeping driveways, sidewalks and dryer vents clear.
- 10. No nuisance will be allowed on lots or any use or practice that is a source of annoyance to other lot owners or interferes with the peaceful possession and proper use of the lots by other residents.
- 11. Offensive or unlawful use will not be made of lots. All valid laws, zoning ordinances and regulations of all government bodies having jurisdiction will be strictly observed.
- 12. installation of radio masts, towers, poles, antennas, aerials, or appurtenances cannot be constructed or maintained except for common antennas as required for multiple unit reception systems. installation of satellite dishes must have prior Board approval. Installation of satellite dishes must meet Architectural Committee Restrictions.
- 13. The residence of more than four (4) persons including children will be prohibited in two-bedroom properties. The residence of more than six (6) persons including children will be prohibited in three-bedroom properties.
- 14. Owners will not alter_Jandscape schemeL nor plant in common areas. Common areas, shrub areas, walks and driveways must b€free of all planted flowers, potted plants, statues, ornaments, decorations or other items.
- The optional planting area is thirty-six (36) inch wide strip of Common Area at back and side of end units. The area at the side may extend to the plantings around air conditioner. For interior units, optional planting area is also thirty-six
- (36) inch wide strip of Common Area at back side of units. The optional planting area may be used for plantings of low flowers and shrubs only, at discretion of the Board. The area may be edged with material other than wood. Patio door area may include concrete stepping blocks up to (40) inches along building and thirty-six (36) inches out from building. Maintenance and edging of optional planting area is responsibility of owner. Article VIII Section 2 b.
- 15. Construction of private docks on waten/vays fronting common areas is prohibited. Chairs, benches, tables or other types of furniture must not be left unattended.
- 16. Owners, renters, and guests are bound by any and all rules and regulations as set forth in Heather Walk deed restrictions.

- 17. Owners must complete Heather Walk rental form for rental properties and return to manager 10 days prior to rent/lease of unit.
- 18. Flags One American or one decorative type shall be attached only to brick fascia on either side of garage.
- 19. Gas grills, propane gas tanks and fuel will not be placed or stored within dwelling or garage. Gas and electric grills must be kept on a concrete slab or stone base in the " (36") wide strip of the optional planting area in back of dwelling and moved away from the unit when in use. No hibachi, -gas fired grill, charcoal grill, or other similar devices used for cooking, heating or any other purpose shall be used or kindled under any overhanging portion or within 10 feet of any structure.
- 20. All garbage, trash containers, bicycles and personal property will be stored in area not visible from outside dwelling. Do not place garbage outside night before pickup.
- 21. Association records requests must be directed to Qualified Property Management, inc. via certified mail
- 22. No climbing trees in Common Areas by any persons except tree crew approved 1/20/05
- 23. No electric or gas vehicles are allowed to be driven on any Common Area or Private Roadway of Heather Walk HOA by any person andlor persons under the age of sixteen (16) years old as stated in Florida Statute 316.2085 approved 1/20/05

POLICY FOR SPEAKING AT MEMBERSHIP MEETING

The following paragraph is from The Law of Florida Homeowners Associations Florida State Statue 720.306 (6) "2.12 Speaking at Membership Meetings. It is the right of all association members to speak at any meeting of the membership with reference to all items open for discussion or included on meeting agenda. The Board of Directors of the association may adopt reasonable rules governing the frequency duration, and manner of members statements, but the rules must be in writing and must permit a member to speak for a least (3) minutes on any item." The Heather Walk Homeowners Association enacts the following policy regarding member's rights to speak at membership meetings:

- 1. All members may speak at meetings up to (3) minutes.
- 2. Remarks must be on Heather Walk HOA business.
- 3. The Chairperson (President) will have the authority to determine the appropri ateness of the remarks and will monitor the allotted time.


