President's Corner

Pat Meddings

I hope you had a nice Easter Holiday and have adjusted to another Spring Forward time change. I am hoping for a great Spring Festival with beautiful weather that day. I want to thank everyone that has volunteered to help with counting our ballots and the Spring Festival. We couldn't do it without your assistance. The Spring Festival can use more volunteers at the Festival, for set up, and clean up also. A lot of work is going into this event, we need your support to make it successful.

I have had multiple requests to mail out our statements monthly or get up to date and send out emails. The HPOA Board is not opposed to updating when and where we can update. I know the younger generations generally think everything should be done online via the internet. However, a lot of the members here do not provide us with phone numbers or email addresses. People that have never had jobs using computers may still not use them and may not have an email address. Last I checked we had less than 300 members that have provided us with email addresses. Therefore, electronic mailings or voting is not going to be successful. Monthly mailed statements at .68 cents x 844 would cost The HPOA \$573.92 each month or \$6887.84 each year in postage alone. This doesn't include the cost of ink, paper, envelopes, and paid staff time. The HPOA needs you to help us cut costs and set up automatic

bill pay thru your bank or pay the way you will remember best. We still send out late payment reminders to dozens of people every month and postage keeps increasing. Many owners pay 12 months at a time. I don't feel payment books to over eight hundred owners would be cost effective when a huge percentage will not be needing these booklets. The HPOA investigated setting up Zelle or another pay system and our bank does not provide these to business client's accounts.

I have asked Laurie, our office manager, to provide realtors that contact us and new residents with information about the HPOA dues. The HPOA wants to make sure everyone understands the HPOA dues are separate from the multi-family unit's assessments. Every owner is responsible to pay the HPOA dues for every property they own in The Heather Property Owners Association.

Please update the HPOA office with your current phone number and email address. We often have wrong addresses when owners move and rent their Heather Property and don't give us their new address. If you move between two homes don't forget to designate the address you want as your current address in our files. Thank you.

If you are planning to make any changes to your property, please first complete your request for the property change with any additional information before you begin your project and drop it off at the HPOA office. A copy of the form is in this newsletter. The A&D committee will review your request at their next scheduled meeting to determine whether the property change is within the HPOA Deed Restrictions.

One change some residents have decided to make is to put a side driveway on the front of their property to accommodate another vehicle. Before you begin this project, you must submit a Property Change Request.

Reminder to keep your lawns cut and the landscaping maintained. Remove any tree limbs, branches, weeds, and debris from your property.

The committee has received complaints about unregistered/untagged vehicles parked on lots. This is a violation of the Deed Restrictions as well as a Hernando County Code Enforcement. Notifications have or will be sent to the property owners.



Ponds and everything are still looking good. Some Algae are popping up because we're starting to get the warm weather again, but Agua Scope is on top of that.

Also, Aqua Scope recently went out on a boat and sprayed the Lily Pads to reduce their growth.

HORSESHOES PLAYED WITH 2 PLAYERS OR 2 TEAMS OF 2 PLAYERS

2 STAKES WHICH CAN BE 20 TO 40 FEET APART. TOTAL OF 4 HORSESHOES= 2 IN ONE COLOR AND 2 IN ANOTHER COLOR.

PLAYERS THROW THE HORSESHOES UNDERHANDED.

PLAYERS TAKE TURNS THROWING THE SHOES NEAREST TO THE STAKE. SHOES MUST LAND WITHIN ONE HORSESHOE WIDTH FROM THE STAKE TO SCORE ANY POINT. PITCH FROM THE SAME SIDE OF THE STAKE THROUGH AN INNING, BUT YOU CAN PITCH FROM DIFFERENT SIDES THROUGHOUT THE MATCH. PITCH BOTH SHOES WITHIN 30 SECONDS.

SCORE 1 POINT FOR THE SHOE CLOSEST TO THE STAKE AND 2 POINTS IF BOTH OF YOUR SHOES ARE CLOSEST TO THE STAKE (WITIDN THE WIDTH OF THE HORSESHOE OR ABOUT 6 INCHES).

YOU SCORE 3 POINTS IF YOU MAKE A RINGER. A RINGER MUST COMPLETELY ENCIRCLE THE STAKE. EARN 4 POINTS IF YOU HAVE THE CLOSEST SHOE AND A RINGER.

NO POINTS SCORED IF AN OPPONENT THROWS A RINGER ON TOP OF YOURS.

A RINGER CANCELS ALL <u>CLOSE</u> HORSESHOE POINTS.

IF A PLAYER MAKES 2 RINGERS AND AN OPPONENT PITCHES A RINGER ON TOP OF THEIRS(2 ARE DEAD AND THE PERSON WITH) 2 RINGERS GETS 3 POINTS).

A LEANER SCORES 1 POINT, BUT IF THE OPPONENT MAKES AN EQUAL LEANER THEY CANCEL EACH OTHER OUT.

FIRST TO SCORE 21 WINS


RULES FOR HOPSCOTCH

First draw your pattern using numbers 1-10. You can use sidewalk chalk outside or masking tape inside. The patterns can vary where you place the double numbers (Example: Squares 1-9 are 12 inch x 12 inch. #10 is usually larger.)

You need a marker such as a flat stone, bean bag, coin, stick, etc.

- Stand outside the number one and toss your marker in the first square.
- You lose your turn if the marker lands on the side lines or outside the block.
- If the marker lands inside the square, jump on one foot into the first empty square, avoiding the square that has the marker. Then jump into each of the following empty squares.
- At the double squares land with one foot in each square.
- You lose your turn if you land on a square with the marker, fall, or jump on an outer line or outside the square. Pass the marker to the next player. When it is your turn again you start over with the number you failed to complete.

- At 10 you can land in this square on both feet, turn around, and hop on one foot back to the start.
 When you reach the square with the marker, you pick it up still standing on one foot and complete the course.
- Pass the marker to the next player. The first player to complete all ten squares and return to the start successfully wins.



Foods That Your Dogs Can't Eat

- As we celebrate any occasion, whether it be a holiday, birthday, or barbecue, for many people the occasion also includes a family or friend's dog. So here are reminders of the foods that dogs can't eat.
- **Alcohol:** Even small amounts can cause lethargy, seizures, heart attack, lung failure and death.
- Apple pie: The high-fat crust combined with the apple pie spices can result in issues that include stomach upset/pain, liver disease, high blood pressure and seizures.
- Chocolate: It's highly toxic and can stop a pooch's metabolic process, resulting in diarrhea, vomiting, seizures, and death.
- Coffee, tea, or any caffeinated drink: These overstimulate the nervous system in dogs and causes elevated heart rate, vomiting and seizures.
- Garlic, leeks, or onions: These are members of the Allium family and are highly toxic to dogs and can cause elevated heart rate, anemia, and general weakness. If your dog may have eaten a stray piece of garlic or onion, symptoms may not appear until a few days after ingestion.
- Grapes and raisins: These are highly toxic for dogs. Even small amounts can make a dog ill, leading to rapid kidney failure and death.
- Ice cream: Usually dogs do not tolerate high or fullfat dairy products well. To avoid gastrointestinal distress for your dog, just feed them a frozen fruit treat like blueberries, strawberries, or bananas.
- Raw potatoes: Uncooked potatoes contain solanine, which is toxic to dogs.
- Raw yeast dough: This can ferment, producing alcohol and possible ethanol poisoning.

Your veterinarian can provide you with the best advice to balance your dog's diet.

Plan for Your Pets

If you evacuate your home, **DO NOT LEAVE YOUR PETS OR ANIMALS BEHIND.** It is unlikely for pets or larger animals to survive on their own. If they do, you may not be able to find them when you return.

Get pets ready for an emergency or disaster:

Have a Safe Place to Take Your Pets. Service animals who assist people with special medical needs are allowed in shelters, but traditional pets are not usually allowed. Plan ahead.

- Contact hotels and motels to ask if they're pet friendly.
- · Ask friends, relatives, or others if they would care for your pets at their home.
- Contact boarding facilities and veterinarians who shelter animals in an emergency.
- Ask local animal shelters if they provide temporary shelter or foster pets during an emergency.

Assemble a Pet Disaster Supply Kit:

- Medications and medical records.
- Sturdy leashes, harnesses, and/or carriers to transport pets safely.
- Photo of you and your pet(s) in the event you are separated.
- Food, potable water, bowls, cat litter/pan, and a can opener.
