Pat Meddings called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm – PLEDGE

**Board members present:** Patricia Meddings-President, Events; Joe Cuccio-1st VP, Buildings, Richard Roth-3rd VP, Treasurer; Keith Elder-2nd VP, Grounds/Lochs, RV Compound; Rick Pelletier-Director at Large, RV Compound

#### **Members present:**

Barbara Jamalkowski, Gail Roth, Bobbi Glenn, Bill Adams, Carl & Judy Huffman, Bea Hall

#### **Corporate Secretary:**

Keith made the motion to approve and accept the April 15, 2024 minutes. Rickie 2nded, all were in favor. Motion carried.

Pat mentioned there was an omission in the April 15th newsletter Board Notes that the March 15 minutes were approved.

#### **President/Administration Report:**

Pat reported that the fine request from the Fine Committee on 9082 St Andrews Blvd was received. After some discussion regarding the extensions that had been given the owners to rectify the situation, Pat made a motion to approve the fine requested. Joe 2nded, all were in favor. Motion carried.

Pat also made the suggestion that the A&D policy needed to be looked at to possibly simplify the process.

Pat asked Rickie to report on the committee that was formed to look at members' suggestions and ideas on what needs to be changed in the deed restrictions. Rickie stated that the committee had lost 2 of its' 5 members due to work demands. The remaining 3 committee members are Lisa Cleveland, Lisa Hopper and Walt Ganzer. Rickie made a motion to approve the committee and Keith 2nded. All were in favor. Motion carried.

#### **Treasurer Report:**

Richard reported that it had been a disappointing year due to unexpected costs. We are continuing to work off last years' budget due to the proposed budget for 2024-2025 not being approved. He also reported that after speaking with a bank manager about the difference between a Money Market account and Money Market Savings account he decided the Money Market Savings account was a better option. Richard made a motion to change

from the Money Market account to the Money Market Savings. Joe 2nded, all were in favor. Motion carried.

#### **Heather News:**

Judy reported that the Newsletter should be out on time this month. She appreciates the job that Sir Speedy is doing.

#### A & D Committee:

Keith reported that the Committee is still watching for high, overgrown grass, commercial vehicles and vehicles parked on the grass longer than a few hours or overnight. These items seem to be the items with the most complaints.

Keith also asked that members get the word out that we need volunteers for the A&D, Fine and Deed Restriction committees.

#### Security:

Joe reported that the man in the red Ford pick-up has been arrested for trespass thanks to the Deputies and the help from the people manning the Gatehouse. He stated that the Gatehouse continues to run efficiently and effectively.

He also mentioned the Open Forum being held on Monday, June 10th at 7:00pm and asked that the members present would tell their neighbors. It will be in the June newsletter and he is hoping for a good turnout from the membership. This is a chance for membership to voice their concerns and be heard.

#### **RV** Compound:

Keith reported that the work on the RV Compound has been completed and he and Rickie have been getting a lot of positive feedback about the arrangement of the spaces. The Compound is now completely full. There is a new form that each owner has to sign in order to move back into the compound and they must also bring the new registration to the office for Laurie to put in their file.

#### **Grounds & Lochs:**

Keith reported that AquaScope is coming out monthly to treat every pond, killing the needlegrass and adding the blue dye. He commented on the great job they are doing.

#### **Building:**

Joe commended Keith and Rickie on the job they did spreading the pine bark mulch, keeping the cost down.

He also reported that the sign out front needs to be repaired at some point in the future. The south side was already done but the north side is starting to show wear and tear.

## **TREASURER'S NOTES 5/9/24**

The 2023-2024 Fiscal Year came to an end on April 30th. Unfortunately, it was a disappointing year. Due to an unexpected increase of \$11,717 in our Property Insurance Premium and an expense of \$22,200 for replacing the A/C units in the Community Center, the annual expenses far outweighed our income for the year. The Profit and Loss Statement and the Balance Sheet are included in this Newsletter.

Since our proposed Budget for the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 was not approved, we will be working off of the Budget for last year. The Board is considering numerous expense reductions that will help us to minimize the shortfall that might possibly occur.



# What Florists' Say to Keep Cut Flowers Fresh

Flowers will use water faster and wilt faster if they are placed in bright sunlight or in drafty locations. The cooler they are kept, the longer they will last. Misting cut flowers also helps to prolong their life.

Flowers often wilt because air bubbles trapped in the stem won't let them absorb water. Trimming stems under water will keep this from happening.

Stems can also get plugged with bacteria. Changing the water each day helps. Before placing flowers in a vase, remove the lower leaves to prevent bacterial overgrowth.

If the flowers have been out of water for a while, cut off the bottom inch of the stem for a cleaner cut. Cut at an angle so the stem won't stand flat in the vase.

Sometimes you can revive wilted flowers. Wrap them in a newspaper so the stems are straight.

Put the stem and paper in a vase of water until the stem stands up again.
